2	relating to notice to customers, governmental entities, and other
3	affected persons after significant interruptions of certain
4	services.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 418.192(a), Government Code, is amended
7	by adding Subdivision (3) to read as follows:
8	(3) "Significant interruption of service" means ar
9	interruption of essential products and services provided by a
10	public service provider that lasts one or more hours and affects the
11	provider's entire system, a major division of the provider's
12	system, a community, a critical load, or service to interruptible
13	customers, and a scheduled interruption lasting more than four
14	hours that affects customers who are not notified in advance. The
15	term includes:
16	(A) a loss of service to 20 percent or more of the
17	provider's customers, or 20,000 customers for a provider serving
18	more than 200,000 customers; and
19	(B) interruptions adversely affecting a
20	community such as interruptions of governmental agencies, military
21	bases, universities and schools, major retail centers, and major
22	<pre>employers.</pre>
23	SECTION 2. Section 418.192, Government Code, is amended by

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amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (b) A public service provider shall [may] enter into a
- 3 contract for an emergency notification system described by this
- 4 section for use in informing the provider's customers, governmental
- 5 entities, and other affected persons regarding:
- 6 (1) notice of a disaster<u>,</u> [or] emergency<u>, or</u>
- 7 significant interruption of service; and
- 8 (2) any actions a recipient is required to take during
- 9 a disaster, [or] emergency, or significant interruption of service.
- 10 (b-1) The emergency notification system for which a
- 11 contract is entered into under Subsection (b) must provide notice
- 12 of a significant interruption of service as soon as reasonably
- 13 possible after the interruption occurs. The notice must include:
- 14 (1) the general location of the interruption;
- 15 (2) the cause of the interruption, if known;
- 16 (3) the date and time that the interruption began;
- 17 (4) the estimated date and time that service will be
- 18 restored; and
- 19 <u>(5)</u> the name and telephone number of the public
- 20 service provider.
- 21 (b-2) If the duration of a significant interruption of
- 22 service is longer than 24 hours, the emergency notification system
- 23 for which a contract is entered into under Subsection (b) must
- 24 provide an update to the information required under Subsection
- 25 (b-1) to the public service provider's customers, governmental
- 26 entities, and other affected persons not less than once every 24
- 27 hours that the interruption continues.

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- 1 SECTION 3. Section 418.192(h), Government Code, is
- 2 repealed.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
