- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.151, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (g) and adding Subsections (g-2), (g-3), and
- 7 (g-4) to read as follows:
- 8 (g) To maintain certification as an independent
- 9 organization under this section, an organization's governing body
- 10 must be composed of persons specified by this section [and selected
- 11 in accordance with formal bylaws or protocols of the organization.
- 12 The bylaws or protocols must be approved by the commission and must
- 13 reflect the input of the commission. The bylaws must specify the
- 14 process by which appropriate stakeholders elect members and, for
- 15 unaffiliated members, prescribe professional qualifications for
- 16 selection as a member. The bylaws must require the use of a
- 17 professional search firm to identify candidates for membership of
- 18 unaffiliated members. The process must allow for commission input
- 19 in identifying candidates]. The governing body must be composed
- 20 of:
- 21 (1) the chairman of the commission as an ex officio
- 22 nonvoting member;
- 23 (2) the counsellor as an ex officio voting member

The bylaws must require the use of a professional search 13 firm to identify candidates for membership of unaffiliated members. 14 15 The process must allow for commission input in identifying 16 candidates. 17 (g-3) To qualify to serve as a member of the governing body under Subsection (g)(4), (5), (6), or (7), a person must be a 18 19 resident of this state. maintain certification as an independent 20 (g-4) To organization under this section, an organization's chief executive 21 officer must be a resident of this state. 22 23 SECTION 2. (a) An independent organization certified under

Section 39.151, Utilities Code, by the Public Utility Commission of

Texas before September 1, 2021, shall hold elections and select new

members as needed to modify the organization's governing body to

comply with Section 39.151, Utilities Code, as amended by this Act,

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- 1 as soon as practicable, but not later than September 1, 2022.
- 2 (b) An independent organization certified under Section
- 3 39.151, Utilities Code, by the Public Utility Commission of Texas
- 4 before September 1, 2021, shall ensure that the chief executive
- 5 officer of the organization complies with Section 39.151, Utilities
- 6 Code, as amended by this Act, as soon as practicable, but not later
- 7 than September 1, 2022.
- 8 (c) After September 1, 2022, the Public Utility Commission
- 9 of Texas may decertify an independent organization whose governing
- 10 body does not comply with Section 39.151, Utilities Code, as
- 11 amended by this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
