## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the creation of a commission to study the terminology of
- 3 the penal laws and the justice system of this state.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. COMMISSION TO STUDY TERMINOLOGY OF PENAL LAWS
- 6 AND JUSTICE SYSTEM OF THIS STATE. (a) A commission is created to
- 7 study and review the terminology used in the penal laws and the
- 8 justice system of this state, including the use of the words
- 9 "crime," "criminal," "police," "police officer," and other similar
- 10 terms.
- 11 (b) The commission shall:
- 12 (1) consider the use of terminology described by
- 13 Subsection (a) of this section and evaluate whether the use of that
- 14 terminology has a negative impact on the involvement of persons in
- 15 the justice system of this state; and
- 16 (2) make recommendations to the legislature regarding
- 17 any changes in terminology described by Subsection (a) of this
- 18 section that may help to reduce the involvement of persons in the
- 19 justice system of this state.
- 20 (c) The commission is composed of one representative from
- 21 each of the following entities, appointed by the administrative
- 22 head of that entity:
- 23 (1) the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement;
- 24 (2) the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board;

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- 1 (3) the Caruth Police Institute located at the
- 2 University of North Texas at Dallas;
- 3 (4) the Combined Law Enforcement Associations of Texas
- 4 Retiree Association; and
- 5 (5) the Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management
- 6 Institute of Texas located at Sam Houston State University.
- 7 (d) The entities making appointments under Subsection (c)
- 8 of this section shall, to the greatest extent practicable, ensure
- 9 that the composition of the commission reflects the racial and
- 10 ethnic composition of the state.
- 11 (e) The members shall designate one member of the commission
- 12 to serve as the presiding officer of the commission and another
- 13 member of the commission to serve as the assistant presiding
- 14 officer of the commission.
- 15 (f) A member of the commission is not entitled to
- 16 compensation or reimbursement of expenses.
- 17 (g) The commission shall meet at the call of the presiding
- 18 officer.
- 19 (h) As reasonable and necessary for the commission to
- 20 fulfill the commission's duties under this Act:
- 21 (1) The Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall
- 22 provide administrative support to the commission; and
- 23 (2) Prairie View A&M University shall provide research
- 24 assistance to the commission.
- 25 (i) Not later than November 1, 2022, the commission shall
- 26 report the commission's findings and recommendations to the
- 27 governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of

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- 1 representatives, and the standing committees of the house of
- 2 representatives and the senate with primary jurisdiction over
- 3 criminal justice matters. The commission shall include in its
- 4 recommendations any specific statutes that the commission
- 5 recommends revising or repealing.
- 6 SECTION 2. APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS. Not later than the 60th
- 7 day after the effective date of this Act, the entities making
- 8 appointments under Section 1(c) of this Act shall appoint the
- 9 members of the commission created under this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. ABOLITION OF COMMISSION. The commission is
- 11 abolished and this Act expires December 31, 2022.
- 12 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 13 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 14 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 15 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 16 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
