## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the proposal by the Texas Water Development Board of a
- 3 process to identify and evaluate multiregional water supply
- 4 projects.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. REPORT. (a) In this section:
- 7 (1) "Board" means the Texas Water Development Board.
- 8 (2) "Multiregional water supply project" means a water
- 9 supply project that has the potential to serve more than one
- 10 regional water planning area and:
- 11 (A) create greater yields of water at a lower
- 12 unit cost due to economies of scale; or
- 13 (B) provide strategic water reserves for the
- 14 state's long-term water needs.
- 15 (b) Not later than December 1, 2024, the board shall submit
- 16 to the legislature a report that:
- 17 (1) proposes the framework for the addition of a new
- 18 state-level planning component to the existing regional water
- 19 planning process that would identify and evaluate multiregional
- 20 water supply projects; and
- 21 (2) contains a general outline for a potential work
- 22 plan, timeline, and estimated cost for the implementation of the
- 23 planning component proposed by Subdivision (1) of this subsection.
- 24 (c) In developing the multiregional planning component

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- 1 framework described by Subsection (b)(1) of this section, the board
- 2 shall consider:
- 3 (1) the currently adopted regional and state water
- 4 plans;
- 5 (2) potentially available unused or new water sources,
- 6 including sources related to flooding and seawater;
- 7 (3) information that is readily available regarding
- 8 potential multiregional water supply projects;
- 9 (4) the potential of multiregional water supply
- 10 projects to:
- 11 (A) provide water supplies beyond the 50-year
- 12 state water planning horizon; and
- 13 (B) address droughts worse than the drought of
- 14 record; and
- 15 (5) other relevant factors as determined by the board.
- 16 (d) In developing the report required by Subsection (b) of
- 17 this section, the board may:
- 18 (1) consult with the interregional planning council
- 19 established by Section 16.052, Water Code; and
- 20 (2) contract for research and technical services as
- 21 needed in developing the proposed framework for the multiregional
- 22 planning component of the state water plan.
- SECTION 2. EXPIRATION. This Act expires January 1, 2025.
- 24 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 25 1, 2021.
