2	relating to the creation and activities of the Texas Produced Water
3	Consortium.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 109, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER E. TEXAS PRODUCED WATER CONSORTIUM
8	Sec. 109.201. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Board" means the board established by Section
10	109.203.
11	(2) "Consortium" means the Texas Produced Water
12	<u>Consortium.</u>
13	(3) "Host university" means Texas Tech University.
14	(4) "Private entity" means an individual,
15	corporation, or nonprofit corporation.
16	(5) "Produced water" means naturally occurring water
17	that emerges from the ground during the production of oil or gas.
18	Sec. 109.202. TEXAS PRODUCED WATER CONSORTIUM. The Texas
19	Produced Water Consortium is a consortium consisting of the host
20	university, the board, and private entities. The consortium is
21	created to bring together information resources to study the
22	economics of and technology related to beneficial uses of produced
23	water.
24	Sec. 109.203. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The consortium is

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1	governed by a board composed of representatives of the:
2	(1) Railroad Commission of Texas;
3	(2) State Energy Conservation Office;
4	(3) Texas Commission on Environmental Quality;
5	(4) Texas Economic Development and Tourism Office
6	within the office of the governor; and
7	(5) Texas Water Development Board.
8	(b) Each entity described by Subsection (a) shall select a
9	representative to serve on the board.
10	(c) The board shall meet as often as necessary to ensure the
11	consortium meets the requirements of this subchapter.
12	Sec. 109.204. DUTIES. (a) The consortium shall study the
13	economics of beneficial uses of produced water and technology
14	needed for those uses. After October 1, 2022, the research and
15	investigation goals of the consortium shall be directed by the
16	sponsors of the consortium.
17	(a-1) This subsection expires October 1, 2022. Not later
18	than September 1, 2022, the consortium shall produce a report that
19	includes:
20	(1) suggested changes to law to better enable
21	beneficial uses of produced water;
22	(2) an economically feasible pilot project for state
23	participation in a produced water facility; and
24	(3) an economic model for using produced water in an
25	economic and efficient way.
26	(b) The host university shall:
27	(1) provide staff and other resources necessary for

No. 3096 1 the consortium to meet the requirements of this subchapter; and 2 (2) solicit participation from: (A) the oil and gas industry; 3 4 (B) companies that own or manage the 5 infrastructure to store produced water and transport that water to other locations for reuse; and 6 7 (C) water users, including: 8 (i) agri<u>cultural users;</u> (ii) political subdivisions; 9 10 (iii) universities; and (iv) water utilities. 11 12 (c) The host university may coordinate with other members of the state university system and state agencies to provide resources 13 necessary for the consortium to meet the requirements of this 14 15 subchapter. Sec. 109.205. FUNDING. (a) The board and the host 16 17 university shall collaborate to create a fee structure for private sponsors that establishes fees for various sponsorship levels for 18 19 private entities that may contribute money to the consortium for research and investigation. 20 21 (b) Money paid by private entities as sponsorship fees may be used only for research and investigation conducted by the 22 23 consortium. 24 (c) Except for state money appropriated to the host university for use in meeting the requirements of Section 25 26 109.204(a-1), and resources provided by the host university, other 27 state university system entities, or state agencies, the consortium

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1 may not receive state money.

2 (d) The consortium may accept gifts and grants of money,
3 equipment, or other resources necessary to accomplish the duties of
4 this subchapter.

5 Sec. 109.206. ACCESS TO DATA. (a) In exchange for 6 sponsorship of the consortium, a private entity may receive access 7 to data produced as a result of investigation by the consortium in 8 an amount proportionate to the entity's level of sponsorship.

9 (b) A private entity's access to the consortium's 10 investigation data must be governed by a sponsorship contract 11 between the host university and the entity that describes the data 12 to be released to the private entity.

SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 1, 2021, each state agency described by Section 109.203(a), Education Code, as added by this Act, shall select a representative for the board of the Texas Produced Water Consortium, as required by Section 109.203(b), Education Code, as added by this Act.

(b) Not later than September 1, 2022, the Texas Produced
Water Consortium shall deliver the report required by Section
109.204(a-1), Education Code, as added by this Act.

(c) Not later than September 1, 2023, the Texas Produced Water Consortium shall create the pilot project required by Section 109.204(a-1)(2), Education Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
