- 2 relating to a study and report by the Health and Human Services
- 3 Commission on the continuity of home health services during the
- 4 COVID-19 pandemic.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. (a) In this Act:
- 7 (1) "COVID-19" means the 2019 novel coronavirus
- 8 disease.
- 9 (2) "Home health service" has the meaning assigned by
- 10 Section 142.001, Health and Safety Code.
- 11 (3) "Home health service provider" means a person who
- 12 provides home health services for compensation.
- 13 (b) The Health and Human Services Commission shall conduct a
- 14 study to evaluate the impact of:
- 15 (1) COVID-19 on the continuity of home health services
- 16 provided to patients; and
- 17 (2) the provision of home health services on the
- 18 spread of COVID-19 among patients receiving the services.
- 19 (c) In conducting the study, the Health and Human Services
- 20 Commission shall:
- 21 (1) assess the impact of shortages in the number of
- 22 available home health service providers on the spread of COVID-19;
- 23 (2) assess the impact of the turnover rate for home
- 24 health service providers on the spread of COVID-19; and

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- 1 (3) identify and assess whether any geographic regions
- 2 of this state have been disproportionately affected by the spread
- 3 of COVID-19 and the likelihood that the shortages or turnover rate
- 4 of home health service providers contributed to that spread.
- 5 (d) Not later than September 1, 2022, the Health and Human
- 6 Services Commission shall prepare and submit to the governor, the
- 7 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 8 and each standing committee of the senate and house of
- 9 representatives having jurisdiction over public health a written
- 10 report on the results of the study and any recommendations for
- 11 legislative or other action.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
