A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to state support for comprehensive regional universities
3	in this state.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 62, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter I to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER I. COMPREHENSIVE REGIONAL UNIVERSITY FUNDING
8	Sec. 62.171. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "At-risk student" means an undergraduate student
10	of an eligible institution:
11	(A) whose score on the Scholastic Assessment Test
12	(SAT) or the American College Test (ACT) is less than the national
13	mean score of students' scores on that test; or
14	(B) who has previously received a grant under the
15	federal Pell Grant program or met the Expected Family
16	Contribution(EFC) criterion for a grant under that program.
17	(2) "Comprehensive regional university" means an
18	institution of higher education that is designated as a doctoral,
19	comprehensive, or master's university under the coordinating
20	board's accountability system.
21	(3) "Eligible institution" means a comprehensive
22	regional university.
23	Sec. 62.172. PURPOSE. The purpose of this subchapter is to
24	provide funding to each comprehensive regional university to

- 1 support their mission to serve at-risk students, help meet the
- 2 state's workforce needs, and enhance their regional economies.
- 3 Sec. 62.173. FUNDING. (a) In each state fiscal year,
- 4 amounts shall be appropriated for purposes of this subchapter to
- 5 eligible institutions as follows:
- 6 (1) a base amount of \$500,000 or a greater amount
- 7 provided by appropriation to each eligible institution; and
- 8 (2) \$1,000 or a greater amount provided by
- 9 appropriation for each degree awarded to an at-risk student by an
- 10 eligible institution.
- 11 (b) The number of degrees awarded under Subsection (a)(2) is
- 12 determined by using the average number of degrees awarded to
- 13 <u>at-risk</u> students annually by each institution in the three
- 14 preceding state fiscal years.
- 15 <u>(c) An alternative allocation method for this funding may be</u>
- 16 provided by appropriation.
- 17 Sec. 62.174. STUDY AND REPORT. (a) The coordinating board
- 18 in consultation with a representative group of eligible
- 19 institutions shall conduct a study of the funding methodology
- 20 established under Section 62.173 to determine its effectiveness in:
- 21 (1) allocating state funds fairly and equitably; and
- 22 (2) promoting student success at eligible
- 23 <u>institutions.</u>
- (b) Not later than September 1, 2022, the coordinating board
- 25 shall submit to the governor and the Legislative Budget Board a
- 26 written report that includes the study's findings and any
- 27 recommendations for legislative or other action.

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- 1 (c) This section expires September 1, 2023.
- 2 SECTION 2. (a) The funding for this Act for the state fiscal
- 3 years ending in 2022 and 2023 is contingent on the legislature
- 4 providing a specific appropriation for the implementation of this
- 5 Act in the general appropriations act of the 87th legislature.
- 6 (b) This Act takes effect immediately if this Act receives
- 7 the votes of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, those
- 10 sections take effect September 1, 2021.
