The court 17 shall consider the proposal when determining the just and right 18 19 division of the property under Chapter 7. (c) Notwithstanding any other law, if only one party files a 20 petition for divorce on the grounds of insupportability and if the 21 suit for dissolution of marriage includes a suit affecting the 22 23 parent-child relationship, it is a rebuttable presumption that it
