4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 48.110, Education Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsections (f) and (h) and adding Subsection (j) to read
7	as follows:
8	(f) For purposes of this section, an annual graduate
9	demonstrates:
10	(1) college readiness if the annual graduate:
11	(A) achieves college readiness standards used
12	for accountability purposes under Chapter 39 on the ACT, the SAT, or
13	an assessment instrument designated by the Texas Higher Education
14	Coordinating Board under Section 51.334; and
15	(B) during a time period established by
16	commissioner rule, enrolls at a postsecondary educational
17	institution;
18	(2) career readiness if the annual graduate:
19	(A) both:
20	(i) achieves college readiness standards
21	used for accountability purposes under Chapter 39 on the ACT, the
22	SAT, or an assessment instrument designated by the Texas Higher
23	Education Coordinating Board under Section 51.334; and
24	<u>(ii)</u> [(B)] during a time period established

- 1 by commissioner rule, earns an industry-accepted certificate; $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 2 (B) during a time period established by
- 3 commissioner rule, is employed at or above a minimum salary level,
- 4 as established by commissioner rule; and
- 5 (3) military readiness if the annual graduate:
- 6 (A) achieves a passing score set by the
- 7 applicable military branch on the Armed Services Vocational
- 8 Aptitude Battery; and
- 9 (B) during a time period established by
- 10 commissioner rule, enlists in the armed forces of the United
- 11 States.
- 12 (h) On application by a school district, the commissioner
- 13 may allow annual graduates from the district to satisfy the
- 14 requirement for demonstrating career readiness under Subsection
- 15 $\underline{(f)(2)(A)(ii)}$ $[\underline{(f)(2)(B)}]$ by successfully completing a coherent
- 16 sequence of courses required to obtain an industry-accepted
- 17 certificate. The district must demonstrate in the application that
- 18 the district is unable to provide sufficient courses or programs to
- 19 enable students enrolled at the district to earn an
- 20 industry-accepted certificate within the time period established
- 21 by the commissioner under Subsection (f)(2)(A)(ii) [(f)(2)(B)].
- 22 The commissioner by rule shall provide the criteria required for an
- 23 application under this subsection.
- 24 (j) The commissioner shall adopt rules permitting a school
- 25 district to award to an annual graduate who voluntarily reports the
- 26 graduate's employment and salary information to the district a
- 27 portion of the outcomes bonus to which the district is entitled for

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- 1 an annual graduate demonstrating career readiness under Subsection
- 2 (f)(2)(B).
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 48.1101(a), Education Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (a) The agency shall conduct a study on alternative career
- 6 readiness measures for small and rural school districts to
- 7 determine if annual graduates demonstrate career readiness under
- 8 Section 48.110(f)(2)(A)(ii) [48.110(f)(2)(B)].
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 10 school year.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
