## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to eliminating certain state-required assessment 3 instruments and certain end-of-course assessment instruments not required by federal law. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 39.023(a), Education Code, as effective until September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows: 7 The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate 8 (a) criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess 9 essential knowledge and skills in reading, [writing,] mathematics, 10 11 [social studies,] and science. Except as provided by Subsection 12 (a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection (b) or (1) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in: 13 14 (1) mathematics, annually in grades three through eight; 15 reading, annually in grades three through eight; 16 (2) (3) [writing, including spelling and grammar, 17 in grades four and seven; 18 [(4) social studies, in grade eight; 19 20 [(5)] science, in grades five and eight; and 21 (4) [(6)] any other subject and grade required by 22 federal law. SECTION 2. Section 39.023(a), Education Code, as effective 23 September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows: 24

1 (a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate 2 criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess 3 essential knowledge and skills in reading, mathematics, [social 4 studies,] and science. Except as provided by Subsection (a-2), all 5 students, other than students assessed under Subsection (b) or (l) 6 or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:

7 (1) mathematics, annually in grades three through8 eight;

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(2) reading, annually in grades three through eight;

(3) [social studies, in grade eight;

11 [(4)] science, in grades five and eight; and

12 (4) [(5)] any other subject and grade required by 13 federal law.

14 SECTION 3. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by 15 amending Subsections (c), (c-2), and (c-3) and adding Subsection 16 (q) to read as follows:

17 (c) The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment instruments for secondary-level courses in reading, mathematics, 18 19 and science only as necessary to comply with the Every Student Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.) to be administered 20 only as necessary to meet the minimum requirements of that Act 21 [Algebra I, biology, English I, English II, and United States 22 history. The Algebra I end-of-course assessment instrument must 23 24 be administered with the aid of technology, but may include one or more parts that prohibit the use of technology. The English I and 25 26 English II end-of-course assessment instruments must each assess essential knowledge and skills in both reading and writing and must 27

provide a single score]. A school district shall comply with State 1 Board of Education rules regarding administration of the assessment 2 instruments <u>adopted under</u> [<del>listed in</del>] this subsection. 3 If a student is in a special education program under Subchapter A, 4 5 Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and dismissal committee shall determine whether any allowable modification is 6 necessary in administering to the student an assessment instrument 7 8 required under this subsection. The State Board of Education shall administer the assessment instruments. An end-of-course 9 10 assessment instrument may be administered in multiple parts over more than one day. The State Board of Education shall adopt a 11 schedule for the administration of end-of-course assessment 12 instruments that complies with the requirements of Subsection 13 14 (c-3).

15 (c-2) The agency may adopt end-of-course assessment 16 instruments for courses <u>for which end-of-course assessment</u> 17 <u>instruments are not adopted under</u> [<del>not listed in</del>] Subsection 18 (c). A student's performance on an end-of-course assessment 19 instrument adopted under this subsection is not subject to the 20 performance requirements established under Subsection (c) or 21 Section 39.025.

(c-3) <u>In</u> [Except as provided by Subsection (c-7), in] adopting a schedule for the administration of assessment instruments under this section, the State Board of Education shall ensure that assessment instruments administered under Subsection (a) or (c) are not administered on the first instructional day of a week.

1 (q) Notwithstanding any provision of this section or other law, if changes made to the Every Student Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. 2 Section 6301 et seq.) reduce the number or frequency of assessment 3 instruments required to be administered to students, the State 4 Board of Education shall adopt rules reducing the number or 5 frequency of assessment instruments administered to students under 6 state law, and the commissioner shall ensure that students are not 7 8 assessed in subject areas or in grades that are no longer required to meet the minimum requirements of that Act. 9

10 SECTION 4. Section 39.025(a-1), Education Code, is amended 11 to read as follows:

12 (a-1) A student enrolled in а college preparatory mathematics or English language arts course under Section 28.014 13 14 who satisfies the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness benchmarks prescribed by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating 15 Board under Section 51.334 on an assessment instrument designated 16 17 by the coordinating board under that section administered at the end of the college preparatory mathematics or English language arts 18 19 course satisfies the requirements concerning and is exempt from the administration of the mathematics or reading [Algebra I or the 20 English I and English II] end-of-course assessment instrument 21 applicable, [as prescribed by Section 22 [instruments], as 23  $\frac{39.023(c)_{T}}{c}$  even if the student did not perform satisfactorily on a previous administration of the applicable end-of-course assessment 24 instrument. A student who fails to perform satisfactorily on the 25 26 assessment instrument designated by the coordinating board under Section 51.334 administered as provided by this subsection may 27

retake that assessment instrument for purposes of this subsection
or may take the appropriate end-of-course assessment instrument.

3 SECTION 5. Section 39.203(c), Education Code, is amended to 4 read as follows:

5 (c) In addition to the distinction designations described by Subsections (a) and (b), a campus that satisfies the criteria 6 developed under Section 39.204 shall be awarded a distinction 7 8 designation by the commissioner for outstanding performance in academic achievement reading [English language arts], in 9 10 mathematics, or science[, or social studies].

SECTION 6. Section 39.023(c-7), as added by Chapter 1282 (H.B. 1244), Acts of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, is repealed.

14 SECTION 7. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 15 over another Act of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, 16 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 17 codes.

SECTION 8. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022 school year.

SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
