A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 1 | AN ACT |
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| 2 | relating to civics instruction in public schools. |
| 3 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 4 | SECTION 1. Subchapter J, Chapter 21, Education Code, is |
| 5 | amended by adding Section 21.4555 to read as follows: |
| 6 | Sec. 21.4555. CIVICS ACADEMIES. (a) The commissioner |
| 7 | shall develop and make available civics academies for teachers and |
| 8 | administrators. |
| 9 | (b) The commissioner shall determine to what grade levels |
| 10 | the civics academies apply. In making that determination, the |
| 11 | commissioner shall include grade levels for which the State Board |
| 12 | of Education makes significant revisions to the Texas essential |
| 13 | knowledge and skills under Section 28.0025. |
| 14 | (c) A civics academy developed under this section must |
| 15 | <pre>include training in at least:</pre> |
| 16 | (1) citizenship or civics and related social studies |
| 17 | knowledge and skills as adopted by the State Board of Education; |
| 18 | (2) guided classroom discussion of current events, as |
| 19 | appropriate for the grade level; |
| 20 | (3) simulations and models of governmental and |
| 21 | democratic processes; |
| 22 | (4) media literacy, including instruction in |
| 23 | verification of information and sources and the identification of |
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- 1 (5) strategies for incorporating civics instruction
- 2 into other subject areas.
- 3 (d) From funds appropriated for that purpose, a teacher who
- 4 attends a civics academy may receive a stipend in the amount
- 5 determined by the commissioner. A stipend received under this
- 6 subsection is not considered in determining whether a district is
- 7 paying the teacher the minimum monthly salary under Section 21.402.
- 8 (e) On request of the commissioner, regional education
- 9 service centers shall assist the commissioner and agency with
- 10 training and other activities relating to the development and
- 11 operation of civics academies. The commissioner may seek
- 12 additional assistance from other public and private providers.
- 13 (f) The commissioner is required to implement this section
- 14 only if the legislature appropriates money specifically for that
- 15 purpose. If the legislature does not appropriate money
- 16 specifically for that purpose, the commissioner may, but is not
- 17 required to, implement this section using other appropriations
- 18 a<u>vailable for that purpose</u>.
- 19 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Sections 28.0025 and 28.0201 to read as follows:
- Sec. 28.0025. CIVICS CURRICULUM UPDATE. (a) In this
- 22 section:
- 23 (1) "Civic attitudes" means appreciating the
- 24 importance and responsibility of participation in civic life;
- 25 gaining values such as commitment to the United States' system of
- 26 government and appreciation for free speech and civil discourse;
- 27 and developing civic self-efficiency and understanding of

- 1 perspectives that differ from one's own.
- 2 (2) "Civic behaviors" means practicing civic habits,
- 3 <u>including</u> voting, engaging in <u>de</u>liberative discussions,
- 4 volunteering, attending public meetings, and other civic
- 5 activities.
- 6 (3) "Civic knowledge" means an understanding of the
- 7 history and heritage of civic life; the structure, functions, and
- 8 processes of civic institutions at all levels; founding-era
- 9 documents; geography and economics that affect public policy; and
- 10 the role of the citizen.
- 11 (4) "Civic skills" means the abilities necessary to
- 12 participate as an active and responsible citizen in a republic;
- 13 effectively engage in the civic life and civic institutions of
- 14 one's community, state, and nation; analyze text and determine the
- 15 reliability of sources; formulate and articulate reasoned
- 16 positions; and actively listen and engage in civil discourse.
- 17 (b) To ensure the students of Texas possess sufficient
- 18 knowledge of history to effectively engage in the civil discourse
- 19 of the republic and fulfill the requirements of Section 28.002(h),
- 20 the State Board of Education shall:
- 21 (1) for kindergarten through grade six, revise the
- 22 <u>essential knowledge and skills for social studies to address</u>
- 23 <u>essential civic education</u>, including civic knowledge, civic
- 24 skills, civic attitudes, and civic behaviors, and ensure sufficient
- 25 knowledge of history necessary to ensure proper context for the
- 26 understanding of civic knowledge, civic skills, civic attitudes,
- 27 and civic behaviors; and

- 1 (2) for grade seven through grade twelve, streamline
- 2 the essential knowledge and skills for social studies to enhance
- 3 civic knowledge, civic skills, civic attitudes, and civic
- 4 behaviors.
- 5 (c) The commissioner shall review prekindergarten
- 6 guidelines and incorporate revisions, if necessary, based on the
- 7 revisions to the essential knowledge and skills under this section.
- 8 (d) The State Board of Education shall adopt a recommended
- 9 reading list for kindergarten through grade twelve of
- 10 civics-focused texts that address the content of the social studies
- 11 essential knowledge and skills for each grade that can be used in
- 12 conjunction with teaching the English and Spanish language arts and
- 13 reading standards. The texts should, at a minimum:
- 14 (1) build background knowledge and vocabulary in
- 15 elementary grades; and
- 16 (2) provide a rich study in rhetoric, reasoning, and
- 17 argumentation in secondary grades.
- 18 (e) The agency shall make the reading list in Subsection (d)
- 19 available to every public school in the state.
- 20 (f) The commissioner shall review current research and
- 21 resources and provide proposed revisions to the applicable
- 22 essential knowledge and skills and a preliminary reading list as a
- 23 starting point for the State Board of Education's use in executing
- 24 its duties under Subsections (b) and (d).
- 25 (g) The State Board of Education shall adopt revisions under
- 26 this section on a timeline that allows the development of academies
- 27 under Section 21.4555 and compliance by public schools with Section

- 1 28.0201 by the timeline established in that section.
- 2 Sec. 28.0201. CIVICS INSTRUCTION. (a) Each school
- 3 district and open-enrollment charter school shall:
- 4 (1) integrate civics materials into its curriculum in
- 5 <u>non-social studies courses, as appropriate; and</u>
- 6 (2) ensure that each campus with grade levels
- 7 <u>identified by the commissioner in Section 21.4555(b) has at least</u>
- 8 one teacher and either a principal or a campus instructional leader
- 9 who has attended a civics academy developed under Section 21.4555.
- 10 (b) The agency shall provide assistance to school districts
- 11 and open-enrollment charter schools in complying with the
- 12 requirements under this section.
- (c) Subsection (a) does not apply until school year
- 14 2024-2025. This subsection expires September 1, 2027.
- 15 (d) The commissioner may delay implementation of Subsection
- 16 (a) to a school year no later than school year 2026-2027, if the
- 17 revision of curriculum under Section 28.0025 or the availability of
- 18 civics academies does not occur at a pace that reasonably affords
- 19 public schools the ability to comply with Subsection (a). This
- 20 subsection expires September 1, 2027.
- (e) Notwithstanding Subsections (c) and (d), the
- 22 commissioner may delay implementation of the requirement of
- 23 Subsection (a)(2) if, in accordance with Section 21.4555(f), civics
- 24 academies have not been developed or sufficiently developed to
- 25 allow school districts and open-enrollment charter schools to
- 26 comply with that requirement.
- 27 (f) The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this

- 1 section.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Subsection (c-9) to read as follows:
- 4 (c-9) An assessment instrument developed under Subsection
- 5 (a) or (c) may include excerpts from texts included on the
- 6 recommended reading list adopted under Section 28.0025(d).
- 7 SECTION 4. The Texas Education Agency is required to
- 8 implement a provision of this Act only if the legislature
- 9 appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If the
- 10 legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that
- 11 purpose, the agency may, but is not required to, implement a
- 12 provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that
- 13 purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
