## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the licensing and regulation of athletic trainers.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 451.001(3), Occupations Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	(3) "Athletic training" means the form of health care
7	that <u>is provided</u> [includes the practice of preventing, recognizing,
8	assessing, managing, treating, disposing of, and reconditioning
9	athletic injuries] under the direction or delegated authority of a
10	physician licensed in this state and includes:
11	(A) managing the risk of injury or illness;
12	(B) preventing injury or illness;
13	(C) assessing an injury or illness;
14	(D) providing immediate emergency care and
15	therapeutic intervention for an injury or illness;
16	(E) reconditioning an injury or illness; and
17	(F) administering other health care [or another
18	qualified, licensed health professional who is authorized to refer
19	for health care services within the scope of the person's license].
20	SECTION 2. Section 451.153(a), Occupations Code, is amended
21	to read as follows:
22	(a) An applicant for an athletic trainer license must:
23	(1) have met the athletic training curriculum
24	requirements of a college or university approved by the commission

- 1 and give proof of graduation;
- 2 (2) hold a degree or certificate in physical therapy
- 3 and have completed:
- 4 (A) a basic athletic training course from an
- 5 accredited college or university; and
- 6 (B) an apprenticeship described by Subsection
- 7 (b);  $[\frac{or}{}]$
- 8 (3) have a degree in corrective therapy with at least a
- 9 minor in physical education or health that includes a basic
- 10 athletic training course and meet the apprenticeship requirement or
- 11 any other requirement established by the commission;
- 12 (4) have completed, or have 30 credit hours or less
- 13 remaining to complete, the athletic training curriculum
- 14 requirements of a college or university that is accredited by a
- 15 nationally recognized athletic training accrediting organization
- 16 and approved by the board; or
- 17 (5) have completed, or have 30 credit hours or less
- 18 remaining to complete, a baccalaureate degree or postbaccalaureate
- 19 degree from a college or university that requires:
- 20 (A) not fewer than 24 credit hours related to the
- 21 practice of athletic training; and
- (B) completion of an apprenticeship program in
- 23 athletic training clinical practice consisting of not fewer than
- 24 1,800 hours completed over the course of not fewer than five
- 25 separate semesters, at least 1,500 hours of which must be completed
- 26 while the applicant is a student at the college or university.
- SECTION 3. Section 451.001(1), Occupations Code, is

- 1 repealed.
- 2 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 3 451.153, Occupations Code, apply only to an application for an
- 4 original athletic trainer license submitted on or after the
- 5 effective date of this Act. An application for an original athletic
- 6 trainer license submitted before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 governed by the law in effect on the date the application was
- 8 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 9 purpose.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
