BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 31.0211(c), Education Code, is amended 7 to read as follows: 8 Subject to Subsection (d), funds allotted under this 9 (c) section may be used to: 10 11 (1) purchase: 12 (A) materials on the list adopted by the commissioner, as provided by Section 31.0231; 13 14 (B) instructional materials, regardless of whether the instructional materials are on the list adopted under 15 16 Section 31.024; (C) consumable instructional 17 materials, including workbooks; 18 (D) instructional materials for use in bilingual 19 20 education classes, as provided by Section 31.029; 21 (E) instructional materials for use in college preparatory courses under Section 28.014, as provided by Section 22 23 31.031; 24 (F) supplemental instructional materials, as

1 provided by Section 31.035; 2 state-developed open education (G) resource 3 instructional materials, as provided by Subchapter B-1; 4 (H) instructional materials and technological 5 equipment under any continuing contracts of the district in effect on September 1, 2011; 6 7 (I) technological equipment necessary to support 8 the use of materials included on the list adopted by the commissioner under Section 31.0231 or any instructional materials 9 10 purchased with an allotment under this section; [and] inventory software or systems for storing, 11 (J) 12 managing, and accessing instructional materials and analyzing the usage and effectiveness of the instructional materials; and 13 14 (K) services, equipment, and technology 15 infrastructure necessary to ensure Internet connectivity and 16 adequate bandwidth; and 17 (2) pay: for training educational personnel directly 18 (A) 19 involved in student learning in the appropriate use of instructional materials and for 20 providing for access to technological equipment for instructional use; [and] 21 22 for training personnel in the electronic (B) administration of assessment instruments; and 23 24 (C) the salary and other expenses of an employee who provides technical support for the use of technological 25 26 equipment directly involved in student learning. SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Education Code, 27 is

23	State Board of Education shall ensure that assessment instruments

1 required under Subsection (a) or (c) on the first instructional day

5 (c-8) Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, <u>not more</u> 6 <u>than 75 percent of the available points on</u> an assessment instrument 7 developed under Subsection (a) or (c) may <u>be attributable to</u> [not 8 <u>present more than 75 percent of the</u>] questions <u>presented</u> in a 9 multiple choice format.

10 (o) The agency shall adopt or develop optional interim 11 assessment instruments for each subject or course for each grade 12 level subject to assessment under this section. A school district 13 <u>or open-enrollment charter school</u> may not be required to administer 14 interim assessment instruments adopted or developed under this 15 subsection. An interim assessment instrument:

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(1) must be:

(A) <u>when possible</u>, predictive of the assessment
instrument for the applicable subject or course for that grade
level required under this section; and

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(B) administered electronically; and

(2) may not be used for accountability purposes.

22 SECTION 4. Section 39.0234, Education Code, is amended to 23 read as follows:

Sec. 39.0234. ELECTRONIC ADMINISTRATION OF ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS. <u>Each</u> [The agency shall ensure that] assessment <u>instrument</u> [instruments] required under Section <u>39.023(a), (c), or</u> (1) must be [39.023 are capable of being] administered

1 electronically, unless otherwise provided by commissioner rule.

2 SECTION 5. Sections 39.02341(a) and (b), Education Code, 3 are amended to read as follows:

(a) The agency, in consultation with the State Board of
Education, shall develop a transition plan to administer all
assessment instruments required under <u>Sections 39.023(a), (c), and</u>
(1) [Section 39.023] electronically beginning not later than the
2022-2023 school year. The plan must:

9 (1) evaluate the availability of Internet access for 10 each school district in this state;

(2) identify changes to state law or policy necessary to improve the availability of Internet access described by Subdivision (1);

14 (3) evaluate the state's experience with administering 15 online assessment instruments, including the occurrence or effects 16 of power outages or other types of disruptions of Internet service, 17 and actions taken by the state to mitigate the occurrence and effect 18 of those disruptions; and

19 (4) identify and evaluate actions taken by the state20 to improve the administration of online assessment instruments.

(b) The agency shall implement the transition plan beginning on September 1, 2021. [In order to ensure legislative approval of the transition plan, this subsection expires August 31, 2021.]

SECTION 6. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
 section, this Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022 school year.
 (b) Section 39.0234, Education Code, as amended by this Act,

1 applies beginning with the 2023-2024 school year.

2 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
