5	SECTION 1. Subchapter I, Chapter 521, Transportation Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 521.184 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 521.184. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE TO
8	HOMELESS INDIVIDUAL. (a) In this section, "homeless individual":
9	(1) means an individual who:
10	(A) lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate
11	nighttime residence; or
12	(B) has a primary nighttime residence that is:
13	(i) a supervised publicly or privately
14	operated shelter designed to provide temporary living
15	accommodations, including welfare hotels, congregate shelters, and
16	transitional housing for the mentally ill;
17	(ii) an institution that provides a
18	temporary residence for individuals intended to be
19	institutionalized; or
20	(iii) a public or private place not
21	designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping
22	accommodation for human beings; and
23	(2) does not include an individual who is imprisoned
24	or otherwise detained in a correctional facility.

No. 3292 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (f) and subject to 1 Section 521.4265, a homeless individual is entitled to an exemption 2 from the payment of fees under this chapter for the issuance of a 3 driver's license or personal identification certificate. 4 5 (c) For the purposes of this section, a person's status as a homeless individual must be confirmed by a notarized affidavit 6 7 from: 8 (1) an employee of a homeless shelter or transitional housing facility; 9 (2) an employee of an organization that provides to 10 homeless individuals or assists homeless individuals in obtaining 11 12 services such as health services, mental or behavioral health services, substance abuse services, public assistance services, or 13 14 employment services; 15 (3) an attorney licensed to practice law in this 16 state; 17 (4) a peace officer who is an official homeless 18 liaison; 19 (5) an employee of a faith-based organization that provides benefits or services to homeless individuals; or 20 21 (6) a counselor or administrator at a school attended by the homeless individual. 22 (d) A person may not charge a fee for the affidavit 23 24 described by Subsection (c). 25 (e) An affidavit described by Subsection (c) may not be used 26 for a driver's license or personal identification certificate 27 application if the affidavit was signed more than 60 days before the

1 date the application is submitted.

2 (f) Subsection (b) does not apply to a person subject to the 3 registration requirements of Chapter 62, Code of Criminal 4 Procedure.

5 (g) Rules adopted under this section regarding the issuance 6 of a personal identification certificate to a homeless child or 7 youth, as defined by Section 521.1015, must be consistent with the 8 provisions of that section.

9 SECTION 2. Sections 521.4265(b) and (c), Transportation 10 Code, are amended to read as follows:

(b) For each exemption granted under Section 521.1015, [or] 521.1811, or 521.184, the department shall deposit to the credit of the Texas mobility fund an amount from the identification fee exemption account under Subsection (a) that is equal to the amount of the waived fee that would otherwise be deposited to the mobility fund.

(c) The department may not grant an exemption under Section 521.1015, [or] 521.1811, or 521.184 if money is not available in the identification fee exemption account to meet the requirements of Subsection (b).

SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply to an application for a driver's license or personal identification certificate submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An application for a driver's license or personal identification certificate submitted before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
