3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 551.125(b), Government Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	(b) A meeting held by telephone conference call may be held
7	only if the meeting is held by an advisory board, or:
8	(1) an emergency or public necessity exists within the
9	meaning of Section 551.045 of this chapter; and
10	(2) <u>holding a meeting under Section 551.127</u> [the
11	convening at one location of a quorum of the governmental body] is
12	difficult or impossible[; or
13	[(3) the meeting is held by an advisory board].
14	SECTION 2. Section 551.127, Government Code, is amended by
15	amending Subsections (a-1), (a-3), (b), (e), and (k) and adding
16	Subsections (1) and (m) to read as follows:
17	(a-1) A member [ <del>or employee</del> ] of a governmental body may
18	participate remotely in a meeting of the governmental body by means

- 7 (b) A meeting may be held by videoconference call only if
- 8 the member of the governmental body presiding over the meeting is
- 9 physically present at one location of the meeting that is open to
- 10 the public during the open portions of the meeting [a quorum of the
- 11 governmental body is physically present at one location of the
- 12 meeting, except as provided by Subsection (c)].
- 13 (e) The notice of a meeting to be held by videoconference
- 14 call [must specify as a location of the meeting the location where a
- 15 quorum of the governmental body will be physically present and
- 16 specify the intent to have a quorum present at that location, except
- 17 that the notice of a meeting to be held by videoconference call
- 18 under Subsection (c) must specify as a location of the meeting the
- 19 location where the member of the governmental body presiding over
- 20 the meeting will be physically present and specify the intent to
- 21 have the member of the governmental body presiding over the meeting
- 22 present at that location. The location where the member of the
- 23 governmental body presiding over the meeting is physically present
- 24 shall be open to the public during the open portions of the meeting.
- 25 (k) Without regard to whether a member of the governmental
- 26 body is participating in a meeting from a remote location by
- 27 videoconference call, a governmental body may allow a person to

- 1 speak [member of the public to testify] at a meeting from a remote
- 2 location by videoconference call.
- 3 (1) An employee of a governmental body may participate
- 4 remotely in a meeting of the governmental body by means of a
- 5 videoconference call if the video and audio feed of the employee's
- 6 participation is broadcast live at the meeting and complies with
- 7 the provisions of this section.
- 8 (m) A governmental body whose territory or jurisdiction
- 9 includes an area stricken or threatened by a public health disaster
- 10 declared under Chapter 81, Health and Safety Code, is not required
- 11 to comply with:
- 12 <u>(1)</u> Subsection (f); or
- 13 (2) the provisions of Subsections (b) and (e) that
- 14 require the presiding member's location to be open to the public.
- SECTION 3. Section 81.406(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (b) The task force may meet telephonically in accordance
- 18 with Section 551.125(b)  $[\frac{551.125(b)(3)}{}]$ , Government Code.
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 551.127(c), Government Code, is
- 20 repealed.
- 21 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 22 a meeting for which notice is first posted on or after the effective
- 23 date of this Act.
- 24 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
