H.B. No. 3368

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the program of all-inclusive care for the elderly. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 32.053, Human Resources Code, is amended 4 5 by amending Subsections (b) and (e) and adding Subsections (b-1) and (e-1) to read as follows: 6 7 (b) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to implement this section. In adopting rules, the 8 executive commissioner shall: 9 (1) use the Bienvivir Senior Health Services of El 10 11 Paso initiative as a model for the program; 12 (2) ensure that a person is not required to hold a certificate of authority as a health maintenance organization under 13 Chapter 843, Insurance Code, to provide services under the PACE 14 15 program; ensure that participation in the PACE program is 16 (3) available as an alternative to enrollment in a Medicaid managed 17 care plan under Chapter 533, Government Code, for eligible 18 recipients, including recipients eligible for assistance under 19 20 both the medical assistance and Medicare programs; 21 (4) ensure that the commission's enrollment broker 22 complies with Subsection (b-1); 23 (5) ensure that qualified eligible recipients who 24 choose to participate in the PACE program are allowed to enroll in

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1 the program [managed care organizations that contract under Chapter 533, Government Code, consider the availability of the PACE program 2 3 when considering whether to refer a recipient to a nursing facility or other long-term care facility]; 4 5 (6) [and 6 [(5)] establish protocols for the referral of eligible 7 persons to the PACE program; and 8 (7) ensure that the PACE enrollment census is allowed 9 to grow based on need as determined by the enrollment census. (b-1) The commission's enrollment broker shall: 10 (1) identify all individuals enrolling in Medicaid who 11 12 are eligible for nursing facility care and reside in a PACE program service area and advise those individuals that they may: 13 (A) request an eligibility assessment 14 to 15 participate in the PACE program; and 16 (B) choose to enroll in the PACE program as an 17 alternative to enrolling in a managed care plan under Chapter 533, Government Code; and 18 (2) on a monthly basis, refer each recipient described 19 by Subdivision (1) that the broker advised to the PACE program site 20 in the corresponding service area. 21 The commission [Department of Aging and Disability 22 (e) Services] and area agencies on aging shall develop and implement a 23 24 coordinated plan to promote PACE program sites operating under this section. The executive commissioner shall adopt policies and 25 26 procedures, including operating guidelines, to ensure that

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caseworkers and any other appropriate department staff discuss the

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1 benefits of participating in the PACE program with long-term care
2 clients.

3 <u>(e-1) The commission shall develop educational materials</u> 4 <u>that describe the PACE program, including the services provided</u> 5 <u>under the program, and the benefits of receiving acute care</u> 6 <u>services and long-term care services through the program.</u>

7 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act 8 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a 9 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, 10 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or 11 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the 12 waiver or authorization is granted.

13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
