## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to a statewide requirement for natural gas generating 3 capacity.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 39.9044, Utilities Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (a-1) to 7 read as follows:

(a) Of the total amount of generating capacity installed in 8 this state, [It is the intent of the legislature that] 50 percent 9 must [of the megawatts of generating capacity installed in this 10 state after January 1, 2000, use natural gas. To the extent 11 12 permitted by law, the commission shall establish a program to encourage utilities to comply with this section by using natural 13 14 gas produced in this state as the preferential fuel. This section does not apply to generating capacity for renewable energy 15 16 technologies.

17 <u>(a-1) If the commission determines that the market price for</u> 18 <u>natural gas at the wellhead in this state averages at least \$6 per</u> 19 <u>1,000 cubic feet for at least one month, the requirement</u> 20 <u>established by Subsection (a) does not apply until the price</u> 21 <u>averages less than \$6 for at least one month.</u>

(c) <u>The</u> [Not later than January 1, 2000, the] commission
shall adopt rules necessary to administer and enforce this section
and to perform any necessary studies in cooperation with the

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1 Railroad Commission of Texas. At a minimum, the rules shall:

(1)establish the minimum 2 annual natural gas generation 3 generation requirement for each power company, municipally owned utility, and electric cooperative operating in 4 5 this state in a manner reasonably calculated by the commission to produce, on a statewide basis, compliance with the requirement 6 prescribed by Subsection (a); and 7

8 (2) specify reasonable performance standards that all 9 natural gas capacity additions must meet to count against the 10 requirement prescribed by Subsection (a) and that:

(A) are designed and operated so as to maximize the energy output from the capacity additions in accordance with then-current industry standards and best industry standards; and

(B) encourage the development, construction, and operation of new natural gas energy projects at those sites in this state that have the greatest economic potential for capture and development of this state's environmentally beneficial natural gas resources.

19 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 20 of this Act, the Public Utility Commission of Texas shall adopt the 21 rules necessary to administer and enforce Section 39.9044, 22 Utilities Code, as amended by this Act.

23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
