## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of manufactured homes.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 1201, Occupations Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 1201.1021 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 1201.1021. POWERS OF DIRECTOR DURING DECLARED
7	EMERGENCY. (a) For purposes of this section, a declared emergency
8	exists when an emergency declaration is issued by the governor or a
9	federal agency.
10	(b) During a declared emergency that exceeds a period of 14
11	days, the director may:
12	(1) waive licensing requirements to ensure the
13	continued and adequate supply of professionals to build, sell,
14	transport, insure, finance, and install manufactured homes; and
15	(2) require a person to register with the department
16	before engaging in any activity regulated under this chapter.
17	(c) Following the cessation of a declared emergency, the
18	director may require a person registered with the department under
19	Subsection (b)(2) to comply with the criminal history background
20	check requirements and other licensing requirements of this
21	<pre>chapter.</pre>
22	(d) All actions regulated by this chapter and actions needed
23	to construct, transport, install, sell, finance, rent, and insure
24	manufactured homes are essential services that must be allowed to

- 1 continue to operate at a statewide level during a declared
- 2 emergency.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 1201.1025, Occupations Code, is amended
- 4 by adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (c) to read as
- 5 follows:
- 6 (a-1) A person is exempt from holding a retailer's license
- 7 as required by Section 1201.101(b) if all manufactured homes sold
- 8 or offered for sale by the person are:
- 9 <u>(1) located in a manufactured home community, as</u>
- 10 defined by Section 94.001, Property Code; and
- 11 (2) sold or offered for sale to the same purchaser in
- 12 connection with a sale of the real property of the community.
- 13 (c) A person who is eligible for an exemption under this
- 14 section remains subject to the other applicable provisions of this
- 15 subchapter and department rules regarding the sale or transfer of
- 16 manufactured homes.
- SECTION 3. Section 1201.1031(a), Occupations Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) Except as provided by Section 1201.1021, the [The]
- 20 department shall require that an applicant for a license or renewal
- 21 of an unexpired license submit a complete and legible set of
- 22 fingerprints, on a form prescribed by the board, to the department
- 23 or to the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of obtaining
- 24 criminal history record information from the Department of Public
- 25 Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The applicant is
- 26 required to submit a set of fingerprints only once under this
- 27 section unless a replacement set is otherwise needed to complete

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   the criminal history check required by this section.

- 8 SECTION 7. Section 1201.219(a), Occupations Code, is

- 11 Code, a [A] lien on manufactured homes in a retailer's inventory is
- 12 perfected only by filing the lien with the department on the
- 13 required form. Once perfected, the lien applies to the
- 14 manufactured homes in the inventory as well as to any proceeds from
- 15 the sale of those homes. The department may suspend or revoke the
- 16 license of a retailer who fails to satisfy a perfected inventory
- 17 lien.
- 18 SECTION 8. Section 1201.357(b), Occupations Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (b) If the manufacturer, retailer, or installer, as
- 21 applicable, fails or refuses to provide warranty service in
- 22 accordance with the department order under Section 1201.356, the
- 23 director may [shall] hold an informal meeting at which the
- 24 manufacturer, retailer, or installer must show cause as to why the
- 25 manufacturer's, retailer's, or installer's license should not be
- 26 suspended or revoked and at which the consumer may express the
- 27 person's views. Following the meeting, the director shall either

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- 1 resolve the matter by agreed order, dismiss the matter if no
- 2 violation is found to have occurred, or institute an administrative
- 3 action, which may include license suspension or revocation, the
- 4 assessment of administrative penalties, or a combination of such
- 5 actions.
- 6 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
