Notwithstanding Section 9.310, Business & Commerce 10 (a) Code, a [A] lien on manufactured homes in <u>a retailer's</u> inventory is 11 12 perfected only by filing the lien with the department on the form. Once perfected, the 13 required lien applies to the 14 manufactured homes in the inventory as well as to any proceeds from 15 the sale of those homes. The department may suspend or revoke the license of a retailer who fails to satisfy a perfected inventory 16 17 lien.

18 SECTION 8. Section 1201.357(b), Occupations Code, is 19 amended to read as follows:

(b) If the manufacturer, retailer, or installer, 20 as applicable, fails or refuses to provide warranty service 21 in accordance with the department order under Section 1201.356, the 22 director may [shall] hold an informal meeting at which the 23 24 manufacturer, retailer, or installer must show cause as to why the manufacturer's, retailer's, or installer's license should not be 25 26 suspended or revoked and at which the consumer may express the person's views. Following the meeting, the director shall either 27

1 resolve the matter by agreed order, dismiss the matter if no
2 violation is found to have occurred, or institute an administrative
3 action, which may include license suspension or revocation, the
4 assessment of administrative penalties, or a combination of such
