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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of manufactured homes. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 1201, Occupations Code, is 4 5 amended by adding Section 1201.1021 to read as follows: Sec. 1201.1021. POWERS OF DIRECTOR DURING DECLARED 6 EMERGENCY. (a) For purposes of this section, a declared emergency 7 exists when an emergency declaration is issued by the governor or a 8 9 federal agency. (b) During a declared emergency that exceeds a period of 14 10 days, the director: 11 12 (1) shall waive all licensing requirements to ensure 13 the continued and adequate supply of professionals to build, sell, 14 transport, insure, finance, and install manufactured homes; and (2) may require a person to register with the 15 16 department before engaging in any activity regulated under this 17 chapter. (c) Following the cessation of a declared emergency, the 18 director may require a person registered with the department under 19 Subsection (b)(2) to comply with the criminal history background 20 check requirements and other licensing requirements of this 21 22 chapter. 23 (d) All actions regulated by this chapter and actions needed to construct, transport, install, sell, finance, rent, and insure 24

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1	manufactured homes are essential services that must be allowed to
2	continue to operate at a statewide level during a declared
3	emergency.
4	SECTION 2. Section 1201.1025, Occupations Code, is amended
5	by adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (c) to read as
6	follows:
7	(a-1) A person is exempt from holding a retailer's license
8	as required by Section 1201.101(b) if all manufactured homes sold
9	or offered for sale by the person are:
10	(1) located in a manufactured home community, as
11	defined by Section 94.001, Property Code; and
12	(2) sold or offered for sale to the same purchaser in
13	connection with a sale of a lot or parcel of real property located
14	in the community.
15	(c) A person who is eligible for an exemption under this
16	section remains subject to the other applicable provisions of this
17	subchapter <u>and department rules</u> regarding the sale <u>or transfer</u> of
18	manufactured homes.
19	SECTION 3. Section 1201.1031(a), Occupations Code, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	(a) <u>Except as provided by Section 1201.1021, the</u> [The]
22	department shall require that an applicant for a license or renewal
23	of an unexpired license submit a complete and legible set of
24	fingerprints, on a form prescribed by the board, to the department
25	or to the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of obtaining
26	criminal history record information from the Department of Public
27	Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The applicant is

No. 3417 required to submit a set of fingerprints only once under this 1 section unless a replacement set is otherwise needed to complete 2 3 the criminal history check required by this section. 4 SECTION 4. Section 1201.104(g), Occupations Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 (g) Subsections (a), (a-2), (a-3), and (a-4) do not apply: 7 (1) to a license holder who applies: 8 (A) [(1)] for a license for an additional business location; or 9 10 (B) [(2)] to renew or reinstate a license; or (2) during a declared emergency as described by 11 12 Section 1201.1021. SECTION 5. Section 1201.153(c), Occupations Code, 13 is 14 amended to read as follows: (c) The notice must: 15 16 (1) contain the information required by: 17 (A) the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; or 18 19 (B) the board; and 20 (2) be of the type, size, and format required by the 21 director. SECTION 6. Section 1201.201(5), Occupations Code, 22 is 23 amended to read as follows: 24 (5) "Inventory": 25 (A) means: 26 (i) new manufactured homes purchased by a retailer from a manufacturer; and 27

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1 (ii) used manufactured homes that: 2 (a) $\left[\frac{(A)}{(A)}\right]$ a retailer has designated 3 as the retailer's inventory for sale pursuant to the process implemented by the department; and 4 5 (b) [(B)] are not used as residential 6 dwellings when so designated; and 7 (B) does not include manufactured homes used by a 8 retailer as equipment, as defined by Section 9.102(a)(33), Business & Commerce Code. 9 10 SECTION 7. Section 1201.219(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 11 Notwithstanding Section 9.310, Business & Commerce 12 (a) Code, a [A] lien on manufactured homes in a retailer's inventory is 13 perfected only by filing the lien with the department on the 14 15 required form. Once perfected, the lien applies to the manufactured homes in the inventory as well as to any proceeds from 16 17 the sale of those homes. The department may suspend or revoke the license of a retailer who fails to satisfy a perfected inventory 18 lien. 19 SECTION 8. Section 1201.357(b), Occupations 20 Code, is 21 amended to read as follows: (b) If the manufacturer, retailer, or installer, 22 as 23 applicable, fails or refuses to provide warranty service in 24 accordance with the department order under Section 1201.356, the director may [shall] hold an informal meeting at which the 25 26 manufacturer, retailer, or installer must show cause as to why the manufacturer's, retailer's, or installer's license should not be 27

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1 suspended or revoked and at which the consumer may express the 2 person's views. Following the meeting, the director shall either 3 resolve the matter by agreed order, dismiss the matter if no 4 violation is found to have occurred, or institute an administrative 5 action, which may include license suspension or revocation, the 6 assessment of administrative penalties, or a combination of such 7 actions.

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SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
