## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to electronic voter registration through a voter
- 3 registration agency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 13.002, Election Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (e-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) A person desiring to register to vote must submit an
- 9 application to the registrar of the county in which the person
- 10 resides. Except as provided by Subsections [Subsection] (e) and
- 11 (e-1), an application must be submitted by personal delivery, by
- 12 mail, or by telephonic facsimile machine in accordance with
- 13 Sections 13.143(d) and (d-2).
- 14 (e-1) A registrar shall adopt procedures to allow a voter
- 15 registration agency to deliver a completed voter registration
- 16 application over the Internet. The secretary of state shall review
- 17 any procedures adopted under this section to ensure the procedures
- 18 comply with the provisions of this code.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 20.032, Election Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 20.032. REGISTRATION PROCEDURES. (a) An appropriate
- 22 agency employee shall routinely inform each person who applies [in
- 23 person] for agency services of the opportunity to complete a voter
- 24 registration application form and on request shall provide

- 1 nonpartisan voter registration assistance to the applicant.
- 2 (b) An agency that provides services at a person's residence
- 3 shall provide the opportunity to complete the form and the
- 4 assistance under Subsection (a) at the residence.
- 5 (c) On receipt of a registration application, the
- 6 appropriate agency employee shall review it for completeness [in
- 7 the applicant's presence]. If the application does not contain all
- 8 the required information and the required signature, the agency
- 9 employee shall return the application to the applicant for
- 10 completion and resubmission.
- 11 (d) Information regarding the agency or office to which an
- 12 application is submitted is confidential and may be used only for
- 13 voter registration purposes.
- 14 (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an agency
- 15 shall adopt procedures providing for:
- 16 (1) a person applying for initial services,
- 17 recertification, renewal, or change of address with the agency over
- 18 the Internet to also complete a voter registration application
- 19 online; and
- 20 (2) the delivery of a voter registration application
- 21 to the voter registrar over the Internet.
- 22 <u>(f) For purposes of a voter registration application</u>
- 23 completed under this chapter, an electronic signature satisfies the
- 24 requirement that an application be signed under Section 13.002(b).
- 25 SECTION 3. Section 20.065(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 26 read as follows:
- 27 (a) At the end of each day a Department of Public Safety

- 1 office is regularly open for business, the manager of the office
- 2 shall deliver [by mail or in person] to the voter registrar of the
- 3 county in which the office is located each completed voter
- 4 registration application and applicable change of address
- 5 submitted to a department employee.
- 6 SECTION 4. Section 20.092(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) A public library shall provide to each person of voting
- 9 age who applies [in person] for an original or renewal of a library
- 10 card an opportunity to complete a voter registration application
- 11 form.
- 12 SECTION 5. (a) The voter registrar of a county must adopt
- 13 procedures for the acceptance of voter registration applications
- 14 under Section 13.002(e-1), Election Code, as added by this Act, not
- 15 later than September 1, 2021.
- 16 (b) A voter registration agency must adopt procedures as
- 17 required by Section 20.032(e), Election Code, as added by this Act,
- 18 not later than September 1, 2021.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
