## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to certain duties of the Texas Medical Board regarding a
3	complaint against a license holder.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 164.007, Occupations Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsection (a-1) and adding Subsection (a-2) to read as
7	follows:
8	(a-1) Subject to the board's authority to obtain judicial
9	review under Section 164.0072, if the administrative law judge
10	determines that the complaint that is the subject of the contested
11	case is baseless, unfounded, or based on insufficient evidence, not
12	later than the 10th business day after the date of the judge's order
13	the board shall, as applicable:
14	(1) if the board reported the complaint to a federal
15	entity, including the National Practitioner Data Bank, submit a
16	void report to the entity; and
17	(2) remove from the board's Internet website:
18	(A) any description of the complaint; and
19	(B) any previous board order regarding the
20	<pre>complaint.</pre>
21	(a-2) Notwithstanding Section 2001.058(e), Government
22	Code, the board may not change a finding of fact or conclusion of
23	law or vacate or modify an order of the administrative law judge.
24	For each case, the board has the sole authority and discretion to

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- 1 determine the appropriate action or sanction. The administrative
- 2 law judge may not make any recommendation regarding the appropriate
- 3 action or sanction.
- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to a complaint for which a disciplinary order or action of the Texas
- 6 Medical Board:
- 7 (1) is involved in litigation on the effective date of
- 8 this Act; or
- 9 (2) becomes final on or after the effective date of
- 10 this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
