1-14 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-15 AN ACT

1-16 relating to the authority of the Texas Department of Insurance to
1-17 rescind a certificate of compliance issued for an improvement for
1-18 purposes of coverage through the Texas Windstorm Insurance
1-19 Association.

1-20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-21 SECTION 1. Section 2210.2515(k), Insurance Code, is amended
1-22 to read as follows:

1-23 (k) The department may not rescind a certificate of
1-24 compliance after issuing the certificate [issued] under this
1-25 section [~~if the department finds that the improvement does not~~
1-26 ~~comply with the applicable building code under the plan of~~
1-27 ~~operation]. [The commissioner may adopt rules as necessary to~~
1-28 ~~implement this subsection.]~~

1-29 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
1-30 certificate of compliance that is in effect or issued on or after
1-31 the effective date of this Act.

1-32 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-33 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-34 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-35 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-36 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
