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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to personal financial literacy and career skills courses for high school students in public schools. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 8.051(d), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (d) Each regional education service center shall maintain core services for purchase by school districts and campuses. The 8 9 core services are: (1) training and assistance in: 10 11 (A) teaching each subject area assessed under 12 Section 39.023; and 13 providing instruction in personal financial (B) 14 literacy and career skills as required under Section 28.0021; (2) training and assistance in providing a gifted and 15 16 talented program and each program that qualifies for a funding allotment under Section 48.102, 48.104, or 48.105; 17 18 (3) assistance specifically designed for a school district or campus assigned an unacceptable performance rating 19 20 under Section 39.054; 21 (4) training and assistance to teachers, administrators, members of district boards of trustees, and members 22 23 of site-based decision-making committees; 24 (5) assistance specifically designed for a school

district that is considered out of compliance with state or federal special education requirements, based on the agency's most recent compliance review of the district's special education programs; and (6) assistance in complying with state laws and rules.

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5 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 28.0021, Education Code, 6 is amended to read as follows:

7 Sec. 28.0021. PERSONAL FINANCIAL LITERACY AND CAREER 8 <u>SKILLS</u>.

9 SECTION 3. Section 28.0021, Education Code, is amended by 10 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as 11 follows:

Each school district and each open-enrollment charter 12 (b) school that offers a high school program shall provide a [an 13 14 elective] course in personal financial literacy and career skills 15 that meets the requirements for [a one-half elective] credit under Section 28.025, using materials approved by the State Board of 16 17 Education. The course may be offered as a distinct course in personal financial literacy and career skills or as an elective 18 19 course or existing course that includes instruction in personal financial literacy and career skills sufficient to meet the 20 requirements for one-half credit under Section 28.025(b-1)(9). The 21 instruction in personal financial literacy and career skills must 22 23 include instruction on:

instruction. A district or school may offer the program in

course under Section 28.0021.

25 SECTION 5. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, is amended 26 to read as follows:

(4) three credits in social studies under Section 28.002(a)(1)(D), including one credit in United States history, at least one-half credit in government and at least one-half credit in economics, and one credit in world geography or world history;

(5) except as provided under Subsections (b-12), (b-13), and (b-14), two credits in the same language in a language other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A);

4	SECTION 6. Section 29.917(a), Education Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	(a) From funds appropriated for the purpose, the
7	commissioner may award grants to organizations that provide
8	volunteers to teach classroom or after-school programs to enhance:
9	<pre>(1) college readiness;</pre>
10	<pre>(2) workforce readiness;</pre>
11	(3) dropout prevention; or
12	(4) personal financial literacy and career skills.
13	SECTION 7. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as amended
14	by this Act, applies only to students entering the ninth grade
15	during the 2021-2022 school year or a later school year. For
16	students entering a grade above ninth grade during the 2021-2022

17 school year, Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as that section 18 existed before amendment by this Act, applies, and that section is 19 continued in effect for that purpose.

20 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
