A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of the commercial oyster mariculture
3	advisory board.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 75, Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 75.0108 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 75.0108. COMMERCIAL OYSTER MARICULTURE ADVISORY
8	BOARD. (a) In this section, "advisory board" means the commercial
9	oyster mariculture advisory board established under this section.
10	(b) The commercial oyster mariculture advisory board is
11	established within the office of the governor to advise all state
12	agencies with regulatory authority over the commercial oyster
13	mariculture industry.
14	(c) The advisory board consists of seven members appointed
15	by the governor as follows:
16	(1) four members must:
17	(A) represent the commercial oyster mariculture
18	industry, seafood industry, or related industries; and
19	(B) have a documented interest in the promotion
20	of entrepreneurship, free enterprise, and the increased use,
21	consumption, marketing, and sale of native oysters in this state;
22	<u>and</u>
23	(2) three members must:
24	(A) represent the scientific and conservation

- 1 community in this state; and
- 2 (B) have a documented interest in the
- 3 sustainability of the natural coastal environment of this state.
- 4 (d) Advisory board members serve staggered three-year
- 5 terms, with the terms of two or three members expiring February 1 of
- 6 each year.
- 7 (e) If a vacancy occurs on the advisory board, the governor
- 8 shall appoint a replacement who meets the qualifications for the
- 9 vacant position to serve for the remainder of the term.
- 10 (f) The governor shall designate an advisory board member
- 11 described by Subsection (c)(1) to serve as the advisory board's
- 12 presiding officer for a one-year term. The presiding officer may
- 13 vote on any matter before the advisory board.
- 14 (g) Advisory board members serve without compensation but
- 15 are entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses
- 16 <u>incurred in performing official duties authorized by the office of</u>
- 17 the governor.
- 18 (h) The advisory board shall make recommendations to the
- 19 governor and all relevant agencies concerning the commercial oyster
- 20 mariculture industry, including recommendations regarding:
- 21 (1) promoting the use, consumption, marketing, and
- 22 <u>sale of maricultured oysters;</u>
- 23 (2) promoting sustainable commercial oyster
- 24 mariculture; and
- 25 (3) commercial oyster mariculture permits and
- 26 regulations.
- 27 (i) In performing the advisory board's duties under this

section, the advisory board may consult with agencies of this state 1 and the United States, including the: 2 3 (1) Parks and Wildlife Department; (2) General Land Office; 4 (3) Department of Agriculture; 5 (4) Department of State Health Services; 6 (5) National Marine Fisheries Service; 7 8 (6) United States Army Corps of Engineers; and 9 (7) United States Coast Guard. (j) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the 10 advisory board. 11 SECTION 2. Not later than December 31, 2021, the governor 12 shall appoint the initial members of the commercial oyster 13 14 mariculture advisory board under Section 75.0108, Parks and 15 Wildlife Code, as added by this Act. Notwithstanding Section 75.0108(d), Parks and Wildlife Code, as added by this Act, in making 16 17 the initial appointments, the governor shall designate two members to terms expiring February 1, 2023, two members to terms expiring 18 19 February 1, 2024, and three members to terms expiring February 1, 20 2025. 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 23

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
