- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 773.012(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The advisory council is composed of the following 20
- 8 [19] members appointed by the governor:
- 9 (1) a board-certified emergency physician, appointed
- 10 from a list of names recommended by a statewide professional
- 11 association of emergency physicians;
- 12 (2) a licensed physician who is an emergency medical
- 13 services medical director, appointed from a list of names
- 14 recommended by a statewide professional association of emergency
- 15 medical services medical directors;
- 16 (3) a registered nurse, appointed from a list of names
- 17 recommended by a statewide professional association of emergency
- 18 nurses;
- 19 (4) a fire chief for a municipality that provides
- 20 emergency medical services, appointed from a list of names
- 21 recommended by a statewide fire chiefs association;
- 22 (5) an officer or employee of a private provider of
- 23 emergency medical services who is involved with the development of
- 24 a Texas Trauma System, appointed from a list of names recommended by

- 1 a statewide association of private providers of emergency medical
- 2 services;
- 3 (6) a volunteer who provides emergency medical
- 4 services, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide
- 5 association of volunteers;
- 6 (7) an educator in the field of emergency medical
- 7 services;
- 8 (8) a member of an emergency medical services air
- 9 medical team or unit, appointed from a list of names recommended by
- 10 a statewide emergency medical services air medical association;
- 11 (9) a representative of a fire department that
- 12 provides emergency medical services, appointed from a list of names
- 13 recommended by a statewide association of firefighters;
- 14 (10) a representative of hospitals who is affiliated
- 15 with a hospital that is a designated trauma facility in an urban
- 16 community, appointed from a list of names recommended by a
- 17 statewide association of hospitals;
- 18 (11) a representative of hospitals, who is affiliated
- 19 with a hospital that is a designated trauma facility in a rural
- 20 community, appointed from a list of names recommended by a
- 21 statewide association of hospitals;
- 22 (12) a representative of a county provider of
- 23 emergency medical services;
- 24 (13) one licensed physician who is a pediatrician with
- 25 trauma or emergency care expertise;
- 26 (14) one trauma surgeon;
- 27 (15) one registered nurse with trauma expertise;

- 1 (16) a representative of a stand-alone emergency
- 2 medical services agency in a municipality or taxing district,
- 3 appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide
- 4 association representing emergency medical services agencies;
- 5 (17) a certified paramedic, appointed from a list of
- 6 names recommended by a statewide association representing
- 7 emergency medical services agencies or emergency medical services
- 8 personnel; [and]
- 9 (18) a representative of an ambulatory surgical
- 10 center, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide
- 11 association representing ambulatory surgical centers; and
- 12 (19) two representatives of the general public who are
- 13 not qualified to serve under another subdivision of this
- 14 subsection.
- SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2021, the governor
- 16 shall appoint the member of the council as required by Section
- 17 773.012(b)(18), Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
