A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of massage therapy. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 455.152, Occupations Code, is amended to 4 5 read as follows: Sec. 455.152. INELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSE. A person is not 6 7 eligible for a license as a massage establishment, massage school, massage therapist, or massage therapy instructor if the person is 8 9 an individual and has been convicted of, entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to, or received deferred adjudication for $\underline{\boldsymbol{\cdot}}$ 10 11 (1) an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code, or Section 43.03, 43.031, 43.04, 43.041, or 43.05 [Subchapter A, 12 Chapter 43], Penal Code; $[\tau]$ or 13 14 (2) an offense under federal law or the laws of another state containing elements that are substantially similar to the 15 16 elements of an offense described by Subdivision (1) [another sexual offense]. 17 SECTION 2. Section 455.251, Occupations Code, is amended to 18 read as follows: 19 Sec. 455.251. GROUNDS FOR LICENSE DENIAL, [OR] DISCIPLINARY 20 ACTION, OR ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. (a) The commission or 21

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executive director may refuse to issue a license to a person, [and

shall] suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew the license of a person,

or impose an administrative penalty under Subchapter F, Chapter 51,

- 1 on [shall reprimand] a person licensed under this chapter if the
- 2 person:
- 3 (1) obtains or attempts to obtain a license by fraud,
- 4 misrepresentation, or concealment of material facts;
- 5 (2) sells, barters, or offers to sell or barter a
- 6 license;
- 7 (3) violates a rule adopted by the commission under
- 8 this chapter;
- 9 (4) engages in unprofessional conduct as defined by
- 10 commission rule that endangers or is likely to endanger the health,
- 11 welfare, or safety of the public;
- 12 (5) violates an order or ordinance adopted by a
- 13 political subdivision under Chapter 243, Local Government Code; or
- 14 (6) violates this chapter.
- 15 (b) The commission or executive director shall revoke the
- 16 license of a person licensed as a massage therapist or massage
- 17 therapy instructor if:
- 18 (1) the person is convicted of, enters a plea of nolo
- 19 contendere or guilty to, or receives deferred adjudication for:
- 20 <u>(A)</u> an offense <u>under Chapter 20A, Penal</u> Code, or
- 21 <u>Section 43.03, 43.031, 43.04, 43.041, or 43.05, Penal Code</u>
- 22 [involving prostitution or another sexual offense]; or
- 23 (B) an offense under federal law or the laws of
- 24 another state containing elements that are substantially similar to
- 25 the elements of an offense described by Paragraph (A); or
- 26 (2) the commission or executive director determines
- 27 the person has practiced or administered massage therapy at or for a

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1 sexually oriented business.
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- 2 (c) The commission or executive director:
- 3 (1) shall revoke the license of a person licensed as a
- 4 massage school or massage establishment if the commission or
- 5 executive director determines that[+
- 6 $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$ the school or establishment is a sexually
- 7 oriented business; and [or]
- 8 (2) <u>may revoke the license of a person licensed as a</u>
- 9 massage school or massage establishment if the commission or
- 10 executive director determines that any of the following offenses
- 11 occurred on the premises of the school or establishment and [an
- 12 offense involving prostitution or another sexual offense that]
- 13 resulted in a conviction for the offense, a plea of nolo contendere
- 14 or guilty to the offense, or a grant of deferred adjudication for
- 15 the offense:
- 16 (A) an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code;
- 17 (B) an offense under Subchapter A, Chapter 43,
- 18 Penal Code;
- (C) an offense under federal law containing
- 20 elements that are substantially similar to the elements of an
- 21 offense described by Paragraph (A) or (B); or
- 22 (D) another sexual offense under the laws of this
- 23 state [occurred on the premises of the school or establishment].
- SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 25 of this Act, the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall
- 26 adopt rules necessary to implement Sections 455.152 and 455.251,
- 27 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
