(a) The commission or 21 executive director may refuse to issue a license to a person, [and 22 23 shall] suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew the license of a person, or impose an administrative penalty under Subchapter F, Chapter 51, 24

2 (c) The commission or executive director: 3 (1) shall revoke the license of a person licensed as a massage school or massage establishment if the commission or 4 5 executive director determines that [+ [(1)] the school or establishment is a sexually 6 7 oriented business; and [or] 8 (2) may revoke the license of a person licensed as a massage school or massage establishment if the commission or 9 executive director determines that any of the following offenses 10 occurred on the premises of the school or establishment and [an 11 offense involving prostitution or another sexual offense that] 12 resulted in a conviction for the offense, a plea of nolo contendere 13 14 or guilty to the offense, or a grant of deferred adjudication for 15 the offense: 16 (A) an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code; 17 (B) an offense under Subchapter A, Chapter 43, 18 Penal Code; (C) an offense under federal law containing 19 elements that are substantially similar to the elements of an 20 offense described by Paragraph (A) or (B); or 21 22 (D) another sexual offense under the laws of this state [occurred on the premises of the school or establishment]. 23 24 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall 25 26 adopt rules necessary to implement Sections 455.152 and 455.251, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act. 27
