A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of a mental health jail diversion pilot 3 program in Bexar County. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 7, Health and Safety Code, is 5 amended by adding Chapter 581 to read as follows: 6 7 CHAPTER 581. MENTAL HEALTH JAIL DIVERSION PILOT PROGRAM; BEXAR 8 COUNTY Sec. 581.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 9 "Commission" means the Health and Human Services 10 (1) Commission. 11 12 (2) "Texas Vista Medical Center" means the hospital of that name, formerly known as Southwest General Hospital, that is 13 located in Bexar County. 14 Sec. 581.002. MENTAL HEALTH JAIL DIVERSION PILOT PROGRAM. 15 16 The commission, in cooperation with the local mental health authority that serves Bexar County, shall establish a pilot program 17 in Bexar County for the purpose of reducing recidivism and the 18 frequency of arrests, incarceration, and emergency detentions 19 among persons with mental illness in that county. 20 21 Sec. 581.003. CRIMINAL JUSTICE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE MODEL. The local mental health authority that serves Bexar County shall 22 23 design and test through the pilot program a criminal justice mental health service model oriented toward facilitating treatment for 24

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1	persons with mental illness and substance use disorders to reduce
2	recidivism and the frequency of arrests, incarceration, and
3	emergency detentions among persons with mental illness in Bexar
4	County. The model must include evidence-based practices,
5	including:
6	(1) psychiatric services;
7	(2) substance use disorder treatments;
8	(3) treatment for co-occurring mental health and
9	substance use disorders;
10	(4) integrated primary care, mental health, and
11	chemical dependency services;
12	(5) motivational interviews to decrease recidivism;
13	(6) methods to maintain sobriety;
14	(7) medical detoxification services;
15	(8) intensive case management to address social
16	determinants of health;
17	(9) local mental health authority hospital liaison
18	transitional services, including case management;
19	(10) medication-assisted treatment; and
20	(11) treatment of medical issues, including through
21	inpatient hospitalization if necessary.
22	Sec. 581.004. LOCAL SERVICES COORDINATION. In designing
23	the criminal justice mental health service model described by
24	Section 581.003, the local mental health authority that serves
25	Bexar County shall coordinate with University of the Incarnate Word
26	and Texas Vista Medical Center. In providing services under the
27	nilot program the local mental health authority shall use

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1 personnel enrolled in established post-graduate residency training programs through the Texas Institute of Graduate Medical Education 2 3 and Research. For the purpose of the report required under Section 581.008 the local mental health authority shall: 4 5 (1) collaborate with the South Texas Crisis Collaborative to collect and analyze information regarding rates of 6 7 recidivism and the frequency of arrests, incarceration, and 8 emergency detentions among persons served through the pilot 9 program; and 10 (2) provide the information and analysis described by Subdivision (1) to the commission. 11 12 Sec. 581.005. PROGRAM CAPACITY. (a) In implementing the pilot program, the commission shall ensure the program has the 13 14 resources to provide mental health and substance use disorder 15 treatment for incarceration diversion services for not fewer than five inpatient beds and for stays of a period of 90 days. 16 17 (b) Before the commission implements the pilot program, the commission and the local mental health authority that serves Bexar 18 19 County jointly shall establish clear criteria for identifying a target population to be served by the program. The criteria must 20 prioritize serving a target population composed of members at high 21 risk of recidivism and with severe mental illness, substance use 22 disorders, or co-occurring mental illness and substance use 23 24 disorders. (c) The local mental health authority that serves Bexar 25 26 County shall provide directly or through partnerships with other 27 community behavioral health organizations any outpatient services

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1 included under the program as mental health and substance use disorder treatment for incarceration diversion services. 2 The commission is not required to provide funding for outpatient 3 services provided under the program. 4 5 Sec. 581.006. FINANCING THE PROGRAM. (a) In consultation with the local mental health authority that serves Bexar County and 6 7 Texas Vista Medical Center, the commission shall pay a case rate at 8 the rate at which services are funded for the pilot program. The creation of the pilot program under this chapter is contingent on 9 funding from the commission for persons with mental illness or 10 substance use disorders provided by the state for the program. 11 12 (b) It is the intent of the legislature that appropriations made to fund the pilot program are made in addition to and will not 13 14 reduce the amount of appropriations otherwise made to the local 15 mental health authority that serves Bexar County. (c) The local mental health authority that serves Bexar 16 17 County may seek and receive gifts and grants from federal sources, foundations, individuals, and other sources for the benefit of the 18 19 pilot program. Sec. 581.007. INSPECTIONS. The commission may make 20 inspections of the operation of, and provision of mental health and 21 substance use disorder treatment for incarceration diversion 22 23 services through, the pilot program on behalf of the state to ensure 24 state funds are used effectively.

25 <u>Sec. 581.008. REPORT. (a) Not later than December 1, 2022,</u> 26 <u>the executive commissioner shall evaluate and submit a report</u> 27 <u>concerning the effectiveness of the pilot program in reducing</u>

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recidivism and the frequency of arrests, incarceration, and 1 2 emergency detentions among persons with mental illness and substance use disorders in Bexar County to the governor, the 3 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, 4 5 and the presiding officers of the standing committees of the senate and house of representatives having primary jurisdiction over 6 7 health and human services issues and over criminal justice issues. 8 (b) The report must include a description of the features of the criminal justice mental health service model designed and 9 tested under the pilot program and the executive commissioner's 10

recommendation whether to expand use of the model statewide.

12 (c) In conducting the evaluation required under Subsection (a), the executive commissioner, using the information and analysis 13 provided by the local mental health authority that serves Bexar 14 County and the South Texas Crisis Collaborative, shall compare the 15 rate of recidivism in Bexar County among persons in the target 16 17 population before the date the pilot program is implemented in the community to the rate of recidivism among those persons one year 18 19 after the date the program is implemented in the community. The executive commissioner may include in the evaluation measures of 20 the effectiveness of the program related to the well-being of 21 22 persons served under the program.

23 <u>Sec. 581.009. CONCLUSION; EXPIRATION. The pilot program</u> 24 <u>established under this chapter concludes and this chapter expires</u> 25 <u>September 1, 2023.</u>

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
