## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the Texas Commission on Virtual 3 Education. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 48, Education Code, is amended by adding 5 Subchapter I to read as follows: 6 7 SUBCHAPTER I. TEXAS COMMISSION ON VIRTUAL EDUCATION Sec. 48.401. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "commission" 8 9 means the Texas Commission on Virtual Education. Sec. 48.402. TEXAS COMMISSION ON VIRTUAL EDUCATION. (a) 10 The commission is established to develop and make recommendations 11 regarding the delivery of virtual education in the public school 12 system and state funding for virtual education under the Foundation 13 School Program. 14 (b) The commission consists of 13 members appointed as 15 16 follows: 17 (1) four members appointed by the governor; 18 (2) four members appointed by the lieutenant governor; 19 (3) four members appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and 20 21 (4) a member of the State Board of Education, as designated by the chair of that board. 22 23 (c) The members appointed by the governor must have an interest in public education and include at least: 24

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1	(1) one current or retired classroom teacher with at
2	<pre>least 10 years of teaching experience;</pre>
3	(2) one member of the business community; and
4	(3) one member of the civic community.
5	(d) The appointments made by the lieutenant governor and the
6	speaker of the house of representatives must each consist of:
7	(1) three members of the applicable legislative
8	chamber; and
9	(2) an administrator in the public school system or an
10	elected member of the board of trustees of a school district.
11	(e) In making appointments under Subsections (b)(1), (2),
12	and (3), the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
13	house of representatives shall coordinate to ensure that the
14	membership of the commission reflects, to the extent possible, the
15	ethnic and geographic diversity of this state.
16	Sec. 48.403. PRESIDING OFFICER. The governor shall
17	designate the presiding officer of the commission.
18	Sec. 48.404. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of
19	the commission is not entitled to compensation for service on the
20	commission but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and
21	necessary expenses incurred in performing commission duties.
22	Sec. 48.405. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT AND FUNDING. (a) The
23	agency shall provide administrative support for the commission.
24	(b) Funding for the administrative and operational expenses
25	of the commission shall be provided by legislative appropriation
26	made to the agency for that purpose.
27	Sec. 48.406. RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) The commission shall

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1 develop recommendations to address issues related to the delivery 2 of and funding for virtual education, including alternative 3 instructional delivery methods and alternative methods of funding. 4 (b) The commission may establish one or more working groups 5 composed of not more than five members of the commission to study, discuss, and address specific policy issues and recommendations to 6 refer to the commission for consideration. 7 Sec. 48.407. REPORT. Not later than December 31, 2022, the 8 commission shall prepare and deliver a report to the governor and 9 10 the legislature that contains commission recommendations for legislative action to improve the implementation of virtual 11 12 education. Sec. 48.408. PUBLIC MEETINGS AND PUBLIC INFORMATION. 13 (a) The commission may hold public meetings as needed to fulfill its 14 duties under this subchapter. 15 (b) The commission is subject to Chapters 551 and 552, 16 Government Code. 17 Sec. 48.409. COMMISSION 18 ABOLISHED; EXPIRATION OF 19 SUBCHAPTER. The commission is abolished and this subchapter expires January 1, 2023. 20 21 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022 22 school year. 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 25 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021. 27

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
