A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the establishment of the School Psychologists Shortage
- 3 Task Force.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Commissioner" means the commissioner of
- 7 education.
- 8 (2) "Task force" means the School Psychologists
- 9 Shortage Task Force established under Section 2 of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 2. SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS SHORTAGE TASK FORCE. (a)
- 11 The commissioner shall establish the School Psychologists Shortage
- 12 Task Force to study issues related to the shortage of school
- 13 psychologists.
- 14 (b) The members of the task force must include:
- 15 (1) three members appointed by the lieutenant governor
- 16 as follows:
- 17 (A) two members of the senate; and
- 18 (B) one licensed specialist in school
- 19 psychology;
- 20 (2) three members appointed by the speaker of the
- 21 house of representatives as follows:
- 22 (A) two members of the house of representatives;
- 23 and
- 24 (B) one licensed specialist in school

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- 1 psychology; and
- 2 (3) one member of the State Board of Education
- 3 appointed by the commissioner.
- 4 (c) The Texas Education Agency shall provide administrative
- 5 support to the task force.
- 6 (d) The commissioner shall appoint a member of the task
- 7 force to serve as the presiding officer.
- 8 (e) The task force shall meet at the call of the presiding
- 9 officer.
- 10 (f) The task force shall:
- 11 (1) conduct a study on the issues related to the
- 12 shortage of school psychologists among school districts, including
- 13 supply and demand issues for school-based psychological services
- 14 among districts; and
- 15 (2) provide recommendations for increasing the
- 16 presence of school psychologists in school districts and increasing
- 17 the use of school-based psychological services, as needed.
- 18 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than December 31, 2022, the
- 19 task force shall submit a report to the governor and the legislature
- 20 that includes the task force's findings and recommendations under
- 21 this Act.
- 22 SECTION 4. ABOLITION OF TASK FORCE; EXPIRATION. The task
- 23 force is abolished and this Act expires January 1, 2023.
- 24 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 25 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 26 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 27 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for

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1 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
