4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 48, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter H to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER H. TEXAS COMMISSION ON SPECIAL EDUCATION FUNDING
8	Sec. 48.401. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "commission"
9	means the Texas Commission on Special Education Funding.
10	Sec. 48.402. TEXAS COMMISSION ON SPECIAL EDUCATION FUNDING.
11	(a) The commission is established to develop and make
12	recommendations regarding methods of financing special education
13	in public schools.
14	(b) The commission is composed of 13 members, appointed as
15	<u>follows:</u>
16	(1) four members appointed by the governor;
17	(2) four members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
18	(3) four members appointed by the speaker of the house
19	of representatives; and
20	(4) a member of the State Board of Education, as
21	designated by the chair of that board.
22	(c) In making appointments under Subsections (b)(1), (2),
23	and (3), the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
24	house of representatives shall coordinate to ensure that membership

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1 of the commission, to the extent possible, reflects the ethnic and 2 geographic diversity of this state. 3 (d) The members appointed by: 4 (1) the governor must have an interest in public 5 education and at least include: 6 (A) one member who is a current or retired 7 classroom teacher with at least 10 years of experience teaching 8 special education; 9 (B) one member of the business community with 10 experience employing individuals with disabilities; and 11 (C) one person who is a member of an organization 12 with the purpose of supporting students and families serviced by 13 special education; 14 (2) the lieutenant governor must include three members 15 of the senate and one administrator of a public school; and 16 (3) the speaker of the house of representatives must include three members of the house of representatives and one 17 administrator of a public school. 18 Sec. 48.403. PRESIDING OFFICER. 19 The governor shall designate the presiding officer of the commission. 20 21 Sec. 48.404. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of 22 the commission is not entitled to compensation for service on the commission but is entitled to reimbursement for actual and 23 24 necessary expenses incurred in performing commission duties. Sec. 48.405. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT AND FUNDING. (a) The 25 26 agency shall provide administrative support for the commission. 27 (b) Funding for the administrative and operational expenses

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H.B. No. 3707 1 of the commission shall be provided by legislative appropriation 2 made to the agency for that purpose. Sec. 48.406. RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) The commission shall 3 develop recommendations under this subchapter to address issues 4 5 related to special education funding, including: 6 (1) policy changes to the public school finance system 7 to improve funding of special education; and 8 (2) an analysis of and recommendations for a new system, including a matrix-based system that bases funding on the 9 10 nature and intensity levels of special education services necessary to meet the needs of the student. 11 12 (b) The commission may establish one or more working groups composed of not more than five members of the commission to study, 13 discuss, and address specific policy issues and recommendations to 14 refer to the commission for consideration. 15 Sec. 48.407. REPORT. Not later than December 31, 2022, the 16 17 commission shall prepare and deliver a report to the governor and the legislature that recommends statutory changes to improve 18 19 funding for special education. Sec. 48.408. PUBLIC MEETINGS AND PUBLIC INFORMATION. (a) 20 The commission may hold public meetings as needed to fulfill its 21 22 duties under this subchapter. (b) The commission is subject to Chapters 551 and 552, 23 24 Government Code. Sec. 48.409. COMMISSION ABOLISHED; EXPIRATION 25 OF 26 SUBCHAPTER. The commission is abolished and this subchapter 27 expires January 1, 2023.

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1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
