5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 418, Government Code, is amended by
7	adding Subchapter J to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER J. WELLNESS CHECKS FOR MEDICALLY FRAGILE INDIVIDUALS
9	DURING CERTAIN EMERGENCIES
10	Sec. 418.301. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
11	(1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
12	Commission.
13	(2) "Department" means the Department of State Health
14	Services.
15	(3) "Emergency assistance registry" means the
16	registry maintained by the division that provides local emergency
17	planners and emergency responders with additional information on
18	the needs of certain individuals in their communities.
19	(4) "First responder" means any federal, state, or
20	local personnel who may respond to a disaster, including:
21	(A) public health and public safety personnel;
22	(B) commissioned law enforcement personnel;
23	(C) fire protection personnel, including

1	(D) emergency medical services personnel,
2	including hospital emergency facility staff;
3	(E) a member of the National Guard; or
4	(F) a member of the Texas State Guard.
5	(5) "Medically fragile individual" means any
6	individual who, during a time of disaster or emergency, would be
7	particularly vulnerable because of a medical condition, including
8	individuals:
9	(A) with Alzheimer's disease and other related
10	disorders;
11	(B) receiving dialysis services;
12	(C) who are diagnosed with a debilitating chronic
13	illness;
14	(D) who are dependent on oxygen treatment; and
15	(E) who have medical conditions that require
16	24-hour supervision from a skilled nurse.
17	Sec. 418.302. MEDICALLY FRAGILE INDIVIDUAL DESIGNATION.
18	The division shall develop a process for designating individuals
19	who are included in the emergency assistance registry as medically
20	fragile for the purposes of this chapter.
21	Sec. 418.303. EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE REGISTRY ACCESS. The
22	division shall authorize the following persons to access the
23	emergency assistance registry to assist medically fragile
24	individuals during an event described by Section 418.305:
25	(1) the commission;
26	(2) the department;

The division shall 3 collaborate with the persons authorized to access the emergency 4 assistance registry under Section 418.303 and with applicable 5 6 municipalities and counties to ensure that a wellness check is conducted on each medically fragile individual listed in the 7 emergency assistance registry and located in an area that 8 experiences an event described by Section 418.305 to ensure the 9 10 individual has: (1) continuity of care; and 11 12 (2) the ability to continue using electrically powered medical equipment, if applicable. 13 Sec. 418.305. EVENTS REQUIRING WELLNESS CHECKS. (a) The 14 15 division, in collaboration with the commission and the department, shall adopt rules regarding which events require a wellness check, 16 17 including: 18 (1) an extended power, water, or gas outage; 19 (2) a state of disaster declared under this chapter; 20 or 21 (3) any other event considered necessary by the commission, the department, or the division. 22 (b) If more than one disaster is declared for the same 23 24 event, or the same event qualifies as an event requiring a wellness check for multiple reasons under Subsection (a), only one wellness 25

Sec. 418.306. REQUIREMENTS FOR WELLNESS CHECK. (a) The

check is required to be conducted under this subchapter.

- 2 by rule shall develop minimum standards for conducting wellness
- 3 checks. Each county and municipality shall adopt procedures for
- 4 conducting wellness checks in compliance with the minimum
- 5 standards.
- 6 (b) A wellness check on a medically fragile individual under
- 7 this subchapter must:
- 8 <u>(1) include:</u>
- 9 (A) an automated telephone call and text to the
- 10 <u>individual;</u>
- 11 (B) a personalized telephone call to the

- 13 (C) if the individual is unresponsive to a
- 14 telephone call under Paragraph (B), an in-person wellness check;
- 15 <u>and</u>
- 16 (2) be conducted in accordance with the minimum
- 17 standards prescribed by division rule and the procedures of the

- 19 (c) A wellness check must be conducted as soon as
- 20 practicable but not later than 24 hours after the event requiring a
- 21 wellness check occurs.

- 23 the commission and the department, shall adopt rules to implement
- 24 this subchapter.
- 25 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 26 of this Act, the Texas Division of Emergency Management shall adopt
- 27 the rules necessary to implement Subchapter J, Chapter 418,
