- 6 SECTION 1. Section 104.07, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 8 <u>(a-1)</u> In addition to the notice required under Subsection
- 9 (a), the sign must include the contact information for reporting
- 10 suspicious activity to the Department of Public Safety.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 102.101(b), Business & Commerce Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (b) The attorney general by rule shall prescribe the design,
- 14 content, and manner of display of the sign required by this
- 15 section. The sign must:
- 16 (1) be in both English and Spanish; [and]
- 17 (2) include the telephone number and Internet website
- 18 of the National Human Trafficking Resource Center; and
- 19 (3) include the contact information for reporting
- 20 suspicious activity to the Department of Public Safety.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 125.002(f-1), Civil Practice and
- 22 Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:
- (f-1) If the defendant required to execute the bond is a
- 24 hotel, motel, or similar establishment that rents overnight lodging

- 1 to the public and the alleged common nuisance is under Section
- 2 125.0015(a)(6) or (7), the bond must also be conditioned that the
- 3 defendant will, in each of the defendant's lodging units on the
- 4 premises that are the subject of the suit, post in a conspicuous
- 5 place near the room rate information required to be posted under
- 6 Section 2155.001, Occupations Code, a sign that includes:
- 7 <u>(1)</u> an operating toll-free telephone number of a
- 8 nationally recognized information and referral hotline for victims
- 9 of human trafficking; and
- 10 (2) the contact information for reporting suspicious
- 11 activity to the Department of Public Safety.
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 402.0351(b), Government Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (b) The attorney general by rule shall prescribe the design
- 15 and content of a sign regarding services and assistance available
- 16 to victims of human trafficking to be displayed at transportation
- 17 hubs. The sign must be in both English and Spanish and include:
- 18 (1) the telephone number and Internet website of the
- 19 National Human Trafficking Resource Center; [and]
- 20 (2) the contact information for reporting suspicious
- 21 activity to the Department of Public Safety; and
- 22 <u>(3)</u> the key indicators that a person is a victim of
- 23 human trafficking.
- SECTION 5. Section 245.025, Health and Safety Code, is
- 25 amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 26 <u>(a-1) In addition to the information required under</u>
- 27 Subsection (a), the sign must include the contact information for

- 1 reporting suspicious activity to the Department of Public Safety.
- 2 SECTION 6. Section 455.207(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 (b) The sign required by this section must:
- 5 (1) be in English, Spanish, Korean, Mandarin, and any
- 6 other language required by commission rule;
- 7 (2) include a toll-free telephone number of a
- 8 nationally recognized information and referral hotline for victims
- 9 of human trafficking; [and]
- 10 (3) <u>include the contact information for reporting</u>
- 11 suspicious activity to the Department of Public Safety; and
- 12 (4) be displayed in a conspicuous place clearly
- 13 visible to the public.
- 14 SECTION 7. Section 1602.408(c), Occupations Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (c) The sign required by this section must be in English,
- 17 Spanish, and Vietnamese and include:
- 18 (1) a toll-free telephone number of a nationally
- 19 recognized information and referral hotline for victims of human
- 20 trafficking; and
- 21 (2) the contact information for reporting suspicious
- 22 <u>activity to the Department of Public Safety</u>.
- SECTION 8. Not later than December 1, 2021, the Texas
- 24 Alcoholic Beverage Commission shall, in collaboration with the
- 25 Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas, develop guidance
- 26 for compliance with and notify affected license and permit holders
- 27 of the change in law made by this Act to Section 104.07, Alcoholic

- 1 Beverage Code.
- 2 SECTION 9. (a) Not later than December 1, 2021, the
- 3 attorney general shall, in collaboration with the Department of
- 4 Public Safety of the State of Texas, adopt the rules necessary to
- 5 implement the changes in law made by this Act to Section 102.101,
- 6 Business & Commerce Code, and Section 402.0351, Government Code.
- 7 (b) Not later than January 1, 2022:
- 8 (1) a sexually oriented business shall comply with
- 9 Section 102.101, Business & Commerce Code, as amended by this Act;
- 10 and
- 11 (2) a transportation hub shall comply with Section
- 12 402.0351, Government Code, as amended by this Act.
- 13 SECTION 10. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 14 125.002, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, applies only to a suit
- 15 filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A suit filed
- 16 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 17 effect immediately before that date, and that law is continued in
- 18 effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 11. (a) Not later than December 1, 2021, the
- 20 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
- 21 shall, in collaboration with the Department of Public Safety of the
- 22 State of Texas, adopt the rules necessary to implement the change in
- 23 law made by this Act to Section 245.025, Health and Safety Code.
- (b) Not later than January 1, 2022, a hospital or abortion
- 25 facility shall comply with Section 245.025, Health and Safety Code,
- 26 as amended by this Act.
- SECTION 12. (a) Not later than December 1, 2021, the Texas

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- 1 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall, in collaboration with
- 2 the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas, adopt the
- 3 rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this Act to
- 4 Sections 455.207 and 1602.408, Occupations Code.
- 5 (b) Not later than January 1, 2022:
- 6 (1) a massage establishment or massage school shall
- 7 comply with Section 455.207, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 8 Act; and
- 9 (2) a licensed facility as defined by Section
- 10 1602.408(a), Occupations Code, shall comply with Section 1602.408,
- 11 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- 12 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
