A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- relating to the professional nursing programs that may receive 2 grants under the professional nursing shortage reduction program.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Section 61.9621, Education Code, is amended to 5
- read as follows: 6
- Sec. 61.9621. DEFINITION. 7 Ιn this subchapter,
- "professional nursing program" means an educational program that is 8
- 9 offered by a public or private institution of higher education and
- 10 that:

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- 11 (1) prepares [for preparing] students to attain [for]
- 12 initial licensure as registered nurses; or
- 13 (2) leads students, including registered nurses
- 14 holding an associate or comparable degree, to earn a bachelor of
- science degree in nursing. 15
- SECTION 2. Section 61.9622, Education Code, is amended to 16
- read as follows: 17
- 18 Sec. 61.9622. PROGRAM. A professional nursing shortage
- reduction program is established to increase the number and types 19
- of registered nurses in order to meet the needs for registered 20
- nurses in this state. The board shall administer the professional 21
- nursing shortage reduction program to make grants for those 22
- 23 purposes to professional nursing programs and other entities
- involved with those programs [a professional nursing program in the 24

- 1 preparation of students for initial licensure as registered nurses
- 2 in order to increase the number and types of registered nurses to
- 3 meet the needs for registered nurses in the state].
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 61.9623(a), Education Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A grant from the professional nursing shortage
- 7 reduction program to a professional nursing program or other entity
- 8 described by Section 61.9622 [involved with a professional nursing
- 9 program in the preparation of students for initial licensure as
- 10 registered nurses] must be:
- 11 (1) expended exclusively on costs related to:
- 12 (A) enrolling additional students;
- 13 (B) nursing faculty enhancement in accordance
- 14 with Section 61.96231;
- 15 (C) encouraging innovation in the recruitment
- 16 and retention of students, including the recruitment and retention
- 17 of Spanish-speaking and bilingual students; or
- 18 (D) identifying, developing, or implementing
- 19 innovative methods to make the most effective use of limited
- 20 professional nursing program faculty, instructional or clinical
- 21 space, and other resources, including:
- 22 (i) sharing curriculum and administrative
- 23 or instructional personnel, facilities, and responsibilities
- 24 between two or more professional nursing programs located in the
- 25 same region of this state; and
- 26 (ii) using preceptors or part-time faculty
- 27 to provide clinical instruction in order to address the need for

- 1 qualified faculty to accommodate increased student enrollment in
- 2 the professional nursing program;
- 3 (2) contingent on the professional nursing program's
- 4 having been approved as a professional nursing program by the board
- 5 or the Texas Board of Nursing, as appropriate;
- 6 (3) contingent on the professional nursing program's
- 7 not being on probation with the Texas Board of Nursing or other
- 8 accrediting body; and
- 9 (4) if granted to increase enrollments, contingent on
- 10 the professional nursing program's ability to enroll additional
- 11 students, including having the necessary classroom space and
- 12 clinical slots.
- SECTION 4. Sections 61.96232(a) and (b), Education Code,
- 14 are amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) The board by rule shall establish a process under which
- 16 a public or private institution of higher education that offers a
- 17 professional nursing program may apply for a grant under this
- 18 subchapter and the commissioner of higher education, contingent on
- 19 appropriations of money for the grants, selects one or more
- 20 applicants to receive a grant based on criteria established by
- 21 board rule. The criteria must include the institution's agreement
- 22 that the institution's professional nursing program will enroll
- 23 additional students or graduate additional students in a program
- 24 that:
- 25 (1) prepares students [prepared] for initial
- 26 licensure as registered nurses; or
- 27 (2) leads students, including registered nurses

- 1 holding an associate or comparable degree, to earn a bachelor of
- 2 science degree in nursing.
- 3 (b) The process established under Subsection (a) may
- 4 authorize the commissioner of higher education to accept a joint
- 5 application from multiple institutions that agree to cooperate on a
- 6 regional or joint basis for their professional nursing programs to
- 7 enroll additional students or graduate additional students
- 8 <u>described</u> by <u>Subsection (a)</u> [prepared for initial licensure as
- 9 registered nurses].
- SECTION 5. Section 61.9626(a), Education Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (a) Each institution of higher education that has a
- 13 professional nursing program shall submit an annual report to the
- 14 board detailing its strategy for increasing the number of students
- 15 <u>who</u> [that] graduate from the program prepared to attain initial
- 16 [for] licensure as registered nurses or who earn a bachelor of
- 17 science degree in nursing. The report must include:
- 18 (1) the capacity of the program, either alone or in
- 19 cooperation with one or more other programs, to graduate more
- 20 students who are prepared to attain initial [for] licensure or who
- 21 earn a bachelor of science degree as described by this subsection
- 22 [as registered nurses]; and
- 23 (2) the resources allocated to increase the number of
- 24 students who [that] graduate from the program prepared to attain
- 25 initial [for] licensure or who earn a bachelor of science degree as
- 26 described by this subsection [as registered nurses].
- 27 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
