17	SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 32, Education Code, is
18	amended by adding Section 32.158 to read as follows:
19	Sec. 32.158. RECORDINGS OF DISTANCE LEARNING INSTRUCTION.
20	(a) A school district may not retain a recording of distance
21	learning instruction for more than 30 days after the date the
22	recording is made, except to comply with recording and retention
23	laws applicable to students enrolled in special education programs
24	under Subchapter A, Chapter 29.

20	the information sharing and analysis organization established by
21	the Department of Information Resources under Section 2054.0594,

23	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
