- 8 Sec. 328.001. PROHIBITIONS CONCERNING SALE OF GOODS ONLINE.
- 9 A person may not sell, use, or cause to be used any method,

- 12 (1) functions as a bypass in the purchasing process;
- 13 (2) disguises the identity of the purchaser;
- 14 (3) permits the purchase of a quantity of goods in a

- 16 one purchaser as specified by the seller or operator on the website;

- 18 <u>(4) circumvents a security measure, access control</u>

- 22 (a) The attorney general may investigate a claim that a person
