25 (32) [(33)] officers commissioned by the State Board 26 of Dental Examiners under Section 254.013, Occupations Code, 27 subject to the limitations imposed by that section;

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1 (33) [(34)] investigators commissioned by the Texas
2 Juvenile Justice Department as officers under Section 221.011,
3 Human Resources Code; and

4 (34) [(35)] the fire marshal and any related officers,
5 inspectors, or investigators commissioned by a county under
6 Subchapter B, Chapter 352, Local Government Code.

7 SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 23, Transportation Code,
8 is amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 23. AIRPORT <u>POLICE FORCES</u> [SECURITY PERSONNEL]

SECTION 3. Section 23.001, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 23.001. ESTABLISHMENT OF AIRPORT POLICE [SECURITY] 12 FORCE; COMMISSIONING OF PEACE OFFICERS. The governing body of a 13 14 joint board, as defined by Section 22.071, or the governing body of 15 a political subdivision that operates an airport served by an air carrier certificated by the Federal Aviation Administration [Civil 16 17 Aeronautics Board] or the United States Department of Transportation may: 18

19 (1) establish an airport <u>police</u> [security] force; and 20 (2) commission and employ a peace officer, subject to 21 <u>Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, if the employee takes and files the</u> 22 <u>oath required of peace officers</u> [employ airport security 23 <u>personnel</u>].

24 SECTION 4. Sections 23.002 and 23.003, Transportation Code, 25 are repealed.

26 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
