H.B. No. 3846

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the scheduling of the first day of school for students by school districts and open-enrollment charter schools. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 12A.003(b), Education Code, is amended 5 to read as follows: 6 7 (b) A local innovation plan must: (1) provide for a comprehensive educational program 8 9 for the district, which program may include: (A) innovative 10 curriculum, instructional 11 methods, and provisions regarding community participation, campus 12 governance, and parental involvement; 13 (B) except as provided by Section 12A.004(a), 14 modifications to the school day or year; 15 (C) provisions regarding the district budget and 16 sustainable program funding; accountability and assessment measures that 17 (D) exceed the requirements of state and federal law; and 18 any other innovations prescribed by the board 19 (E) of trustees; and 20 21 (2) identify requirements imposed by this code that 22 inhibit the goals of the plan and from which the district should be 23 exempted on adoption of the plan, subject to Section 12A.004, except for modifications of the first and last day of instruction 24

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1 under Sections 25.0811 and 25.0812.

2 SECTION 2. Section 12A.004(a), Education Code, is amended 3 to read as follows:

4 (a) A local innovation plan may not provide for the 5 exemption of a district designated as a district of innovation from 6 the following provisions of this title:

7 (1) a state or federal requirement applicable to an
8 open-enrollment charter school operating under Subchapter D,
9 Chapter 12;

10 (2) Subchapters A, C, D, and E, Chapter 11, except that 11 a district may be exempt from Sections 11.1511(b)(5) and (14) and 12 Section 11.162;

13 (3) state curriculum and graduation requirements
14 adopted under Chapter 28; [and]

15 (4) academic and financial accountability and 16 sanctions under Chapters 39 and 39A; and

17 (5) the first or last day of instruction requirements 18 under Sections 25.0811 and 25.0812 when a school chooses to reapply 19 to adopt a district of innovation plan.

20 SECTION 3. Section 25.0811(a), Education Code, is amended 21 to read as follows:

(a) Except as provided by this section, a school district may not begin instruction for students for a school year before the fourth Monday in August. A school district may:

(1) begin instruction for students for a school year
before the fourth Monday in August if the district operates a
year-round system under Section 25.084; or

No. 3846 (2) begin instruction for students for a school year 1 on or after the first Monday in August at a campus or at not more 2 3 than 20 percent of the campuses in the district if: 4 (A) the district has a student enrollment of 5 190,000 or more; 6 (B) the district at the beginning of the school 7 year provides, financed with local funds, days of instruction for 8 students at the campus or at each of the multiple campuses, in addition to the minimum [number of days of] instruction time 9 required under Section 25.081; 10 (C) the campus or each of the multiple campuses 11 12 is [are] undergoing comprehensive reform, as determined by the board of trustees of the district; and 13 14 (D) a majority of the students at the campus or at 15 each of the multiple campuses are educationally disadvantaged. SECTION 4. Section 25.0812, Education Code, is amended by 16 17 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows: 18 19 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1) or (b), a school district may not schedule the last day of school for students for a 20 school year before May 15 or after the Friday preceding Memorial 21 22 Day. 23 (a-1) A school district may schedule the last day of school 24 for students for a school year after the Friday preceding Memorial Day if the district operates a year-round system under Section 25 26 25.084.

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SECTION 5. Section 25.084(a), Education Code, is amended to

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1 read as follows:

2 (a) A school district may operate its schools year-round on
3 either a single-track or a multitrack calendar. If a school
4 district adopts a year-round system, the district may modify:

5 (1) the number of contract days of employees and the 6 number of days of operation, including any time required for staff 7 development, planning and preparation, and continuing education, 8 otherwise required by law;

9 (2) testing dates, data reporting, and related 10 matters;

(3) the date of the first day of instruction of the 11 school year under Section 25.0811 and the date of the last day of 12 school for a school year under Section 25.0812 for a school that was 13 operating year-round for the 2020-2021 [2000-2001] school year; and 14 15 (4) а student's eligibility to participate in 16 extracurricular activities when the student's calendar track is not 17 in session.

18 SECTION 6. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 19 over another Act of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, 20 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 21 codes.

22 SECTION 7. This Act applies beginning with the 2022-2023 23 school year.

SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
