## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the authority of the Texas Higher Education 3 Coordinating Board to issue a certificate of authority or 4 certificate of authorization regarding professional degrees.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6 SECTION 1. Section 61.303(c), Education Code, is amended as
7 follows:

(c) The board may issue approve the issuance of a 8 9 certificate of authorization to grant degrees to an exempt institution or person a certificate of authorization to grant 10 degrees. The board may adopt rules regarding a process to allow an 11 12 exempt institution or person to apply for and receive approval for a certificate of authorization under this section. The board shall 13 14 not issue a certificate of authorization to any institution offering a professional degree or representing its credits earned 15 16 in this state are applicable toward a professional degree except to the extent allowed for an authorized institution operating under a 17 State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA). In this 18 subsection, "professional degree" includes Doctor of Medicine 19 (M.D.), Doctor of Osteopathy (D.O.), Doctor of Dental Surgery 20 21 (D.D.S.), Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (D.V.M.), Juris Doctor (J.D.), and Bachelor of Laws (LL.B). 22

23 SECTION 2. Section 61.306, Education Code, is amended by 24 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

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1	(d) The board may not issue a certificate of authority for a
2	private postsecondary institution to grant a professional degree as
3	defined in Sec. 61.306(c), or to represent that credits earned in
4	this state are applicable toward a professional degree unless the
5	Board determines that all of the following conditions have been
6	met:
7	(1) the capacity and ability of similar professional
8	degree programs at institutions of higher education and private or
9	independent institutions of higher education, as those terms are
10	defined in Sec. 61.003, are insufficient to meet the current market
11	needs for the state;
12	(2) the institution seeking the certificate of
13	authority has the necessary faculty and other resources to ensure
14	student success;
15	(3) sufficient placements are available to students
16	for required field-based experience, such as clinicals or
17	clerkships, in the proposed professional degree; and
18	(4) the institution seeking the certificate of
19	authority is subject to, and will meet, the same standard for
20	approval and all academic criteria applicable to similar
21	professional degree programs at institutions of higher education
22	and private or independent institutions of higher education, as
23	those terms are defined in Sec. 61.003.
24	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
