## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the removal of a member of the board of trustees of an
3	independent school district.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 11, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 11.067 to read as follows:
7	Removal from Office. (a) In addition to Local Government Code
8	section 87.013, a member of the board of trustees of an independent
9	school district may be removed from office if the board of trustees,
10	by three-fourths majority vote, passes a resolution of censure
11	against the member finding that the member:
12	(1) intentionally misused school district funds;
13	(2) repeatedly refused to act in accordance with laws,
14	regulations, or policies of the state of Texas relating to public
15	school districts;
16	(3) repeatedly refused to act in accordance with the
17	policies of the school district;
18	(4) intentionally disclosed information regarding a
19	student that is confidential by law;
20	(5) used the member's office to attempt to influence an
21	employee of the school district for the benefit of a student related
22	to the member;
23	(6) failed to complete hourly training requirements as
2/1	established by the State Board of Education or by rule of the

- 1 commissioner of education;
- 2 (7) failed to rescue himself or herself during a
- 3 meeting of the board of trustees from voting on or deliberating on a
- 4 matter in which the member has an objectively identifiable conflict
- 5 of interest; or,
- 6 (8) habitually engaged in or attempted to engage in
- 7 <u>activities relating to school district personnel or a student that</u>
- 8 the board of trustees delegated to the superintendent of schools.
- 9 (b) The removal of a member of the board of trustees of an
- 10 independent school district under this section is subject to
- 11 chapter 87, Local Government Code.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
