## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

l AN ACT
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- 2 relating to affirmative defenses to possession of child
- 3 pornography.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Section 43, Chapter 26, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 43.26. POSSESSION OR PROMOTION OF CHILD PORNOGRAPHY.
- 8 (a) A person commits an offense if:
- 9 (1) the person knowingly or intentionally possesses,
- 10 or knowingly or intentionally accesses with intent to view, visual
- 11 material that visually depicts a child younger than 18 years of age
- 12 at the time the image of the child was made who is engaging in sexual
- 13 conduct, including a child who engages in sexual conduct as a victim
- 14 of an offense under Section 20A.02(a)(5), (6), (7), or (8); and
- 15 (2) the person knows that the material depicts the
- 16 child as described by Subdivision (1).
- 17 (b) In this section:
- 18 (1) "Promote" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 19 43.25.
- 20 (2) "Sexual conduct" has the meaning assigned by
- 21 Section 43.25.
- 22 (3) "Visual material" means:
- 23 (A) any film, photograph, videotape, negative,
- 24 or slide or any photographic reproduction that contains or

- 1 incorporates in any manner any film, photograph, videotape,
- 2 negative, or slide; or
- 3 (B) any disk, diskette, or other physical medium
- 4 that allows an image to be displayed on a computer or other video
- 5 screen and any image transmitted to a computer or other video screen
- 6 by telephone line, cable, satellite transmission, or other method.
- 7 (c) The affirmative defenses provided by Section 43.25(f)
- 8 22.011(d) also apply to a prosecution under this section.
- 9 (d) An offense under Subsection (a) is a felony of the third
- 10 degree, except that the offense is:
- 11 (1) a felony of the second degree if it is shown on the
- 12 trial of the offense that the person has been previously convicted
- 13 one time of an offense under that subsection; and
- 14 (2) a felony of the first degree if it is shown on the
- 15 trial of the offense that the person has been previously convicted
- 16 two or more times of an offense under that subsection.
- 17 (e) A person commits an offense if:
- 18 (1) the person knowingly or intentionally promotes or
- 19 possesses with intent to promote material described by Subsection
- 20 (a)(1); and
- 21 (2) the person knows that the material depicts the
- 22 child as described by Subsection (a)(1).
- 23 (f) A person who possesses visual material that contains six
- 24 or more identical visual depictions of a child as described by
- 25 Subsection (a)(1) is presumed to possess the material with the
- 26 intent to promote the material.
- 27 (g) An offense under Subsection (e) is a felony of the

- 1 second degree, except that the offense is a felony of the first
- 2 degree if it is shown on the trial of the offense that the person has
- 3 been previously convicted of an offense under that subsection.
- 4 (h) It is a defense to prosecution under Subsection (a) or
- 5 (e) that the actor is a law enforcement officer or a school
- 6 administrator who:
- 7 (1) possessed or accessed the visual material in good
- 8 faith solely as a result of an allegation of a violation of Section
- 9 43.261;
- 10 (2) allowed other law enforcement or school
- 11 administrative personnel to possess or access the material only as
- 12 appropriate based on the allegation described by Subdivision (1);
- 13 and
- 14 (3) took reasonable steps to destroy the material
- 15 within an appropriate period following the allegation described by
- 16 Subdivision (1).
- 17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
