2	relating to the establishment of the industry-based certification
3	advisory council and the transfer of certain duties to that
4	advisory council.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 4, Labor Code, is amended by
7	adding Chapter 312 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 312. INDUSTRY-BASED CERTIFICATION ADVISORY COUNCIL
9	Sec. 312.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "advisory
10	council" means the industry-based certification advisory council
11	established under this chapter.
12	Sec. 312.002. ADVISORY COUNCIL. (a) The industry-based
13	certification advisory council is established to advise the
14	commission regarding the alignment of public high school career and
15	technology education programs with current and future workforce
16	needs in communities, regions, and the state.
17	(b) The advisory council is composed of the following nine
18	members:
19	(1) three members representing industry in this state,
20	one each appointed by the governor, the lieutenant governor, and
21	the speaker of the house of representatives;
22	(2) three members representing public school teachers
23	who teach career and technology education courses or public school
24	administrators, one each appointed by the governor, the lieutenant

1 governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives; and
2 (3) three members representing a public junior
3 college, public state college, or public technical institute, as
4 those terms are defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, one each
5 appointed by the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker
6 of the house of representatives.

7 (c) The members of the advisory council serve staggered 8 four-year terms, with the terms of either four or five members 9 expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year.

10 <u>(c-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (c), the initial members</u> 11 <u>appointed shall determine by lot which four of the nine initial</u> 12 <u>members will serve terms that expire February 1, 2023, and which</u> 13 <u>five of the nine initial members will serve terms that expire</u> 14 <u>February 1, 2025. This subsection expires January 1, 2026.</u>

15 (d) A vacancy on the advisory council shall be filled in the
 16 same manner as the original appointment for that position.

17 (e) A member of the advisory council is not entitled to 18 compensation for service as a member of the advisory council but is 19 entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary travel expenses 20 incurred in performing functions as a member of the advisory 21 council, as provided in the General Appropriations Act.

22 (f) Using existing resources, the commission shall provide
23 administrative and staff support for the advisory council.

24 SECTION 2. Section 29.189, Education Code, is transferred 25 to Chapter 312, Labor Code, as added by this Act, redesignated as 26 Section 312.003, Labor Code, and amended to read as follows:

27 <u>Sec. 312.003.</u> [Sec. 29.189.] INVENTORY OF CREDENTIALS AND

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CERTIFICATES. (a) The advisory council [In this section: 1 [(1) "Commission" means 2 the Texas Workforce 3 Commission. 4 [(2) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher 5 Education Coordinating Board. 6 [(b) The agency, the coordinating board, and the commission] shall [jointly] develop [and post on their respective 7 8 Internet websites] an inventory of industry-recognized credentials and certificates that may be earned by a public high school student 9 10 through a career and technology education program and that: are aligned to state and regional workforce needs; 11 (1)12 and serve as an entry point to middle- and high-wage 13 (2) 14 jobs. 15 (b) [(c)] The inventory must include for each credential or certificate: 16 17 (1)the associated career cluster; the awarding entity; 18 (2) the level of education required and any additional 19 (3) requirements for the credential or certificate; 20 21 (4) any fees for obtaining the credential or certificate; and 22 23 the average wage or salary for jobs that require or (5) 24 prefer the credential or certificate. 25 (c) In developing the inventory, the advisory council may 26 consult with local workforce boards, the Texas Workforce Investment Council, the Texas Economic Development and Tourism Office, and the 27

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1 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

2 The advisory council shall establish a process for (d) 3 developing the inventory, including the criteria for the inclusion of a credential or certificate in the inventory. 4

5 (e) The advisory council shall annually review and revise the inventory. 6

7 Each year, [the agency, the coordinating board, and] the (f) 8 commission [jointly] shall:

9 adopt [review] and, if necessary, review [update] (1)10 the inventory; and

(2) provide a copy of the inventory to the Texas 11 12 Education Agency and to each school district and public institution of higher education that offers a career and technology education 13 14 program to public high school students.

15 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act but not later than January 1, 2022, the industry-based 16 17 certification advisory council established under Chapter 312, Labor Code, as added by this Act, shall develop the initial 18 19 inventory required under that chapter.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
