	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of the industry-based certification
3	advisory council and the transfer of certain duties to that
4	advisory council.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 4, Labor Code, is amended by
7	adding Chapter 312 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 312. INDUSTRY-BASED CERTIFICATION ADVISORY COUNCIL
9	Sec. 312.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "advisory
10	council" means the industry-based certification advisory council
11	established under this chapter.
12	Sec. 312.002. ADVISORY COUNCIL. (a) The industry-based
13	certification advisory council is established to advise the
14	commission regarding the alignment of public high school career and
15	technology education programs with current and future workforce
16	needs in communities, regions, and the state.
17	(b) The advisory council is composed of the following nine
18	members:
19	(1) three members representing industry in this state,
20	one each appointed by the governor, the lieutenant governor, and
21	the speaker of the house of representatives;
22	(2) three members representing public school teachers
23	who teach career and technology education courses or public school
24	administrators, one each appointed by the governor, the lieutenant

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1	governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives; and
2	(3) three members representing a public junior college
3	as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, one each appointed by
4	the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house
5	of representatives.
6	(c) The members of the advisory council serve staggered
7	four-year terms, with the terms of either four or five members
8	expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year.
9	(c-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (c), the initial members
10	appointed shall determine by lot which four of the nine initial
11	members will serve terms that expire February 1, 2023, and which
12	five of the nine initial members will serve terms that expire
13	February 1, 2025. This subsection expires January 1, 2026.
14	(d) A vacancy on the advisory council shall be filled in the
15	same manner as the original appointment for that position.
16	(e) A member of the advisory council is not entitled to
17	compensation for service as a member of the advisory council but is
18	entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary travel expenses
19	incurred in performing functions as a member of the advisory
20	council, as provided in the General Appropriations Act.
21	SECTION 2. Section 29.189, Education Code, is transferred
22	to Chapter 312, Labor Code, as added by this Act, redesignated as
23	Section 312.003, Labor Code, and amended to read as follows:
24	Sec. 312.003. [Sec. 29.189.] INVENTORY OF CREDENTIALS AND
25	CERTIFICATES. (a) The advisory council [In this section:
26	[(1) "Commission" means the Texas Workforce
27	Commission.

No. 3938 [(2) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher 1 Education Coordinating Board. 2 3 [(b) The agency, the coordinating board, and the commission] shall [jointly] develop [and post on their respective 4 5 Internet websites] an inventory of industry-recognized credentials and certificates that may be earned by a public high school student 6 through a career and technology education program and that: 7 8 (1) are aligned to state and regional workforce needs; 9 and 10 (2) serve as an entry point to middle- and high-wage jobs. 11 12 (b) [(c)] The inventory must include for each credential or certificate: 13 14 (1)the associated career cluster; 15 (2) the awarding entity; 16 the level of education required and any additional (3) requirements for the credential or certificate; 17 (4) any fees for obtaining the 18 credential or certificate; and 19 the average wage or salary for jobs that require or 20 (5) prefer the credential or certificate. 21 (c) In developing the inventory, the advisory council may 22 consult with local workforce boards, the Texas Workforce Investment 23 24 Council, the Texas Economic Development and Tourism Office, and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. 25 26 (d) The advisory council shall establish a process for developing the inventory, including the criteria for the inclusion 27

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1 of a credential or certificate in the inventory.

2 (e) The advisory council shall annually review and revise
3 the inventory.

4 (f) Each year, [the agency, the coordinating board, and] the 5 commission [jointly] shall:

6 (1) <u>adopt</u> [review] and, if necessary, review [update]
7 the inventory; and

8 (2) provide a copy of the inventory to <u>the Texas</u> 9 <u>Education Agency and to</u> each school district and public institution 10 of higher education that offers a career and technology education 11 program to public high school students.

12 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date 13 of this Act but not later than September 1, 2021, the industry-based 14 certification advisory council established under Chapter 312, 15 Labor Code, as added by this Act, shall develop the initial 16 inventory required under that chapter.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
