- 4 SECTION 1. Section 604A.003, Business & Commerce Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 604A.003. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) A person who knowingly
- 7 violates Section 604A.002 [or 604A.0021] is liable to the state for
- 8 a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed \$500 for each violation.
- 9 The attorney general or the prosecuting attorney in the county in
- 10 which the violation occurs may bring:
- 11 (1) a suit to recover the civil penalty imposed under
- 12 this section; and
- 13 (2) an action in the name of the state to restrain or
- 14 enjoin a person from violating this chapter.
- 15 (b) Before bringing the action, the attorney general or
- 16 prosecuting attorney shall give the person notice of the person's
- 17 noncompliance and liability for a civil penalty. The notice must:
- 18 (1) contain guidance to assist the person in complying
- 19 with this chapter;
- 20 (2) advise the person of the prohibitions under
- 21 <u>Section</u> [Sections] 604A.002 [and 604A.0021]; and
- 22 (3) state that the person may be liable for a civil
- 23 penalty for a subsequent violation of Section 604A.002 [or

- 1 (b-1) If the person complies with <u>Section</u> [Sections]
 2 604A.002 [and 604A.0021] not later than the 30th day after the date
 3 of the notice under Subsection (b), the violation is cured and the
 4 person is not liable for the civil penalty. A person who has
 5 previously received notice of noncompliance under Subsection (b) is
 6 not entitled to notice of or the opportunity to cure a subsequent
 7 violation of Section 604A.002 [or 604A.0021].
- 8 (c) The attorney general or the prosecuting attorney, as
 9 appropriate, is entitled to recover reasonable expenses incurred in
 10 obtaining injunctive relief, civil penalties, or both, under this
 11 section, including reasonable attorney's fees, court costs, and
 12 investigatory costs.
- SECTION 2. Section 604A.0021, Business & Commerce Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
