- 5 SECTION 1. Section 418.108, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (i) and adding Subsection (j) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (i) Except as provided by Subsection (j), a [A] declaration
- 9 under this section may include a restriction that exceeds a
- 10 restriction authorized by Section 352.051, Local Government Code.
- 11 A restriction that exceeds a restriction authorized by Section
- 12 352.051, Local Government Code, is effective only:
- 13 (1) for 60 hours unless extended by the governor; and
- 14 (2) if the county judge requests the governor to grant
- 15 an extension of the restriction.
- (j) Subsection (i) does not authorize a county to prohibit
- 17 or restrict the sale of fireworks.
- SECTION 2. Sections 352.051(c) and (f), Local Government
- 19 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 20 (c) Upon a determination under this section that drought
- 21 conditions exist on average in a specified county, the
- 22 commissioners court of the county by order may prohibit or restrict
- 23 the [sale or] use of restricted fireworks in the unincorporated
- 24 area of the county. In addition, during the December fireworks

- 1 season, the commissioners court of a county by order may restrict or
- 2 prohibit the [sale or] use of restricted fireworks in specified
- 3 areas when conditions on rural acreage in the county not under
- 4 cultivation for a period of at least 12 months are determined to be
- 5 extremely hazardous for the danger of fire because of high grass or
- 6 dry vegetation.
- When a county issues an order restricting or prohibiting 7 (f) 8 the [sale or] use of restricted fireworks under this section, the county may designate one or more areas of appropriate size and 9 accessibility in the county as safe areas where the use of 10 restricted fireworks is not prohibited, and the legislature 11 encourages a county to designate such an area for that purpose. The 12 safe area may be provided by the county, a municipality within the 13 14 county, or an individual, business, or corporation. A safe area may 15 be designated in and provided in the geographic area of the regulatory jurisdiction of a municipality if the activity conducted 16 17 in the safe area is authorized by general law or a municipal regulation or ordinance. An area is considered safe if adequate 18 public safety and fire protection services are provided to the 19 area. A county, municipality, individual, business, or corporation 20 21 is not liable for injuries or damages resulting from the designation, maintenance, or use of the safe area. 22
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
