A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the transfer of certain functions relating to state
- 3 employee leave from the state auditor to the comptroller.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 661.151, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 661.151. <u>COMPTROLLER</u> [STATE AUDITOR] INTERPRETATION.
- 8 (a) The comptroller [state auditor] shall provide a uniform
- 9 interpretation of this <u>chapter</u> [subchapter and Subchapters G and
- 10 $\frac{2}{2}$].
- 11 (b) The comptroller [state auditor] shall report to the
- 12 governor and the legislature any state agency or institution of
- 13 higher education that practices an exception under this chapter
- 14 [exceptions to those laws].
- SECTION 2. Section 661.202(j), Government Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (j) A state agency shall maintain a written statement
- 18 covering the policies and procedures for an extension of leave
- 19 under Subsection (i) and shall make the statement available to all
- 20 agency employees. The state agency shall provide a copy of the
- 21 statement to the comptroller [state auditor] on request.
- SECTION 3. Section 661.9041(c), Government Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (c) The comptroller [state auditor] shall adopt guidelines

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- 1 to assist state agencies in determining the amount of emergency
- 2 leave to grant to an employee under this section as differential
- 3 pay.
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 661.923(c), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (c) Not later than the last day of each quarter of a state
- 7 fiscal year, an agency shall submit a report to the comptroller's
- 8 [state auditor's] office and the Legislative Budget Board that
- 9 includes the name of each agency employee described by Subsection
- 10 (a)(1) who has been granted 168 hours or more of leave under this
- 11 section during that fiscal quarter. The report must include, for
- 12 each employee, a brief statement as to the reason the employee
- 13 remains on leave.
- SECTION 5. (a) Not later than September 10, 2021, the
- 15 following are transferred from the state auditor to the comptroller
- 16 of public accounts:
- 17 (1) the powers and duties of the state auditor
- 18 relating to leave for state employees under Chapter 661, Government
- 19 Code; and
- 20 (2) all property and records in the custody of the
- 21 state auditor that are related to a power or duty transferred under
- 22 this subsection and all funds appropriated by the legislature for
- 23 that power or duty.
- 24 (b) A rule, form, policy, procedure, or decision of the
- 25 state auditor that is related to a power or duty described by
- 26 Subsection (a) of this section continues in effect as a rule, form,
- 27 policy, procedure, or decision of the comptroller of public

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- 1 accounts until superseded by an act of the comptroller of public
- 2 accounts.
- 3 (c) A reference in law or administrative rule to the state
- 4 auditor that relates to a power or duty transferred under
- 5 Subsection (a) of this section means the comptroller of public
- 6 accounts.
- 7 SECTION 6. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 8 of this Act, but not later than September 10, 2021, the state
- 9 auditor and the comptroller of public accounts shall enter into a
- 10 memorandum of understanding that:
- 11 (1) identifies in detail the applicable powers and
- 12 duties that are transferred by this Act; and
- 13 (2) establishes a plan for the identification and
- 14 transfer of the records, property, and unspent appropriations of
- 15 the state auditor that are used for purposes of the state auditor's
- 16 powers and duties that are transferred by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
