## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study by Texas A&M University of the appraisal of
- 3 agricultural land for ad valorem tax purposes.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. STUDY ON TAX APPRAISAL OF AGRICULTURAL LAND. (a)
- 6 The president of Texas A&M University shall designate a department
- 7 or entity at the university to conduct a study of the methods and
- 8 procedures for appraising agricultural land for ad valorem tax
- 9 purposes.
- 10 (b) The study must consider the feasibility and effect of:
- 11 (1) authorizing the comptroller of public accounts to
- 12 accept actual agricultural production data, including data
- 13 regarding expenses and income from production of crops and
- 14 livestock, from an appraisal district in developing rules for the
- 15 appraisal of agricultural land for ad valorem tax purposes;
- 16 (2) determining net to land value by averaging the
- 17 annual net income that a class of land would likely generate over a
- 18 10-year period;
- 19 (3) requiring all of the production expenses incurred
- 20 by a property owner and a tenant, regardless of whether the expenses
- 21 are shared expenses between the property owner and the tenant, to be
- 22 considered when appraising agricultural land;
- 23 (4) requiring a person appraising agricultural land
- 24 for taxation to have knowledge and experience in agricultural land

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- 1 valuation; and
- 2 (5) requiring each appraisal review board to have
- 3 equal membership from rural and non-rural areas.
- 4 SECTION 2. REPORT. Not later than January 1, 2023, Texas
- 5 A&M University shall submit a report on the results of the study to
- 6 the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 7 representatives, and each standing committee of the legislature
- 8 with jurisdiction over agricultural matters.
- 9 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2023.
- 10 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 11 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 12 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 13 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 14 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
