2	relating to a suicide prevention policy in residential child-care
3	facilities and child-placing agencies.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 42.0433 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 42.0433. SUICIDE PREVENTION, INTERVENTION, AND
8	POSTVENTION PLAN. (a) In this section, "postvention" has the
9	meaning assigned by Section 38.351, Education Code.
10	(b) The executive commissioner by rule shall adopt a model
11	suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention policy for use by
12	a residential child-care facility. The model policy must:
13	(1) be based on current and best evidence-based
14	practices;
15	(2) require all employees of the facility to receive
16	annual suicide prevention training that includes understanding of
17	safety planning and screening for risk;
18	(3) promote suicide prevention training for
19	non-employee entities, as appropriate; and
20	(4) include procedures to support children who return
21	to the facility following hospitalization for a mental health
22	condition.
23	(c) Each residential child-care facility shall adopt a
24	suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention policy. A

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1	residential child-care facility may adopt:
2	(1) the model policy adopted by the executive
3	commissioner under Subsection (b); or
4	(2) another suicide prevention, intervention, and
5	postvention policy approved by the executive commissioner.
6	(d) The suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention
7	policy adopted under Subsection (c) may be part of a broader mental
8	health crisis plan if the components of the plan include suicide
9	prevention, intervention, and postvention.
10	(e) The commission shall provide to a residential
11	child-care facility any technical assistance necessary to adopt or
12	implement a suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention
13	policy.
14	SECTION 2. Section 42.252(c), Human Resources Code, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	(c) The operational plan must include:
17	(1) a community engagement plan to develop and, if
18	necessary, improve relations between the general residential
19	operation and the community in which the operation is located that
20	includes:
21	(A) a summary of any discussions the operation
22	had with:
23	(i) local law enforcement; and
24	(ii) local health, therapeutic, and
25	recreational resources available to support children at the
26	operation; and
27	(B) a summary of the opportunities the children

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1 at the operation will have for social interaction in the community; an educational plan describing the applicant's 2 (2) 3 plan to provide for the educational needs of the children at the general residential operation that: 4 5 (A) identifies whether the proposed operation will provide for the public or private education of school-age 6 children at the operation; 7 8 (B) identifies whether the proposed operation will provide for the education of school-age children through a 9 10 local school, off-site charter school, or on-site charter school; 11 (C) includes any discussions, plans, and agreements with the local school district, private school, or local 12 13 charter school that will be providing education to the school-age 14 children at the operation; and 15 (D) if the children are to be enrolled in a public school, includes either: 16 17 (i) a statement from the local independent school district on the impact of the proposed child-care services 18 on the local school district; or 19 20 (ii) an explanation of the reasons the unable to obtain a statement described 21 operation was by Subparagraph (i) and a discussion of other alternative educational 22 23 services that the operation could offer; 24 a trauma-informed plan to address unauthorized (3) absences of children from the general residential operation; [and] 25 26 (4) a suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention plan that meets the requirements of Section 42.0433; 27

2 <u>(5)</u> the qualifications, background, and history, 3 including any compliance history, of each individual who is 4 proposed to be involved in:

5 the management of the operation; and (A) 6 (B) the educational leadership of the operation 7 if the operation will be using an on-site charter school. SECTION 3. Not 8 later than July 1, 2022, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission 9 shall adopt the model suicide prevention, intervention, and 10 postvention policy required by Section 42.0433, Human Resources 11

12 Code, as added by this Act.

13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
