A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of the community development grocery
3	store grant program and to the use of money from the Texas
4	Enterprise Fund for the program.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 481, Government Code, is amended by
7	adding Subchapter EE to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER EE. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GROCERY STORE GRANT PROGRAM
9	Sec. 481.601. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Food desert" means a census tract, based on the
11	most recent information published by the United States Bureau of
12	the Census, in which:
13	(A) the poverty rate is 20 percent or higher or
14	the median family income is at or below 80 percent of the area
15	median family income; and
16	(B) at least 500 people or at least 33 percent of
17	the census area's population reside more than:
18	(i) one mile from a grocery store, in the
19	case of a census tract other than a rural census tract; or
20	(ii) 10 miles from a grocery store, in the
21	<pre>case of a rural census tract.</pre>
22	(2) "Grocery store" means a store that has at least:
23	(A) 66 percent of the store's retail space
24	reserved for the sale of food products;

- 1 (B) 50 percent of the store's food retail space
- 2 reserved for the sale of non-prepared foods or foods intended for
- 3 home preparation and consumption; and
- 4 (C) 30 percent of the store's food retail space
- 5 reserved for the sale of perishable foods, including dairy
- 6 products, fresh produce, fresh meats, poultry, fish, and frozen
- 7 <u>foods</u>.
- 8 (3) "Program" means the community development grocery
- 9 store grant program established under this subchapter.
- 10 Sec. 481.602. ESTABLISHMENT OF GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The
- 11 office shall establish and administer the community development
- 12 grocery store grant program to assist communities by awarding
- 13 grants to business entities proposing to operate a grocery store
- 14 that will be located in a food desert.
- 15 (b) The office may use any available revenue, including
- 16 <u>legislative appropriations</u>, appropriation transfers from the
- 17 trusteed programs within the office of the governor, including
- 18 authorized appropriations from the Texas Enterprise Fund, and any
- 19 other statutorily authorized and appropriate funding sources
- 20 transferred from the trusteed programs within the office of the
- 21 governor, for the purposes of this subchapter.
- Sec. 481.603. ELIGIBILITY FOR GRANT. To be eligible to
- 23 receive a grant under this subchapter, a business entity must:
- 24 (1) demonstrate significant levels of planned capital
- 25 investment at the proposed location, as determined by office rule;
- 26 (2) demonstrate the support of the governing officials
- 27 of the local governmental entities in which the grocery store is

- 1 proposed to be located, particularly in the form of local economic
- 2 development incentive offers; and
- 3 (3) be well established and financially sound.
- 4 Sec. 481.604. APPLICATION. A small business may apply for a
- 5 grant under this subchapter by submitting an application to the
- 6 office in the form and manner prescribed by the office.
- 7 Sec. 481.605. GRANT AGREEMENT. (a) Before awarding a grant
- 8 under this subchapter, the office shall enter into a written
- 9 agreement with the business entity to be awarded the grant
- 10 specifying that if the grocery store closes before the fourth
- 11 anniversary of the date on which the grant is awarded, the
- 12 recipient shall repay the grant and any related interest to the
- 13 state at the agreed rate and on the agreed terms.
- 14 (b) A grant agreement for a grant awarded under this
- 15 <u>subchapter must contain a provision stating that:</u>
- 16 (1) the grocery store will provide health insurance
- 17 benefits to its full-time employees; and
- 18 (2) the total average wages for new jobs at the grocery
- 19 store must meet or exceed the average wage for the same or similar
- 20 type of job in the county in which the grocery store will be
- 21 <u>located.</u>
- Sec. 481.606. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The office
- 23 shall solicit and accept gifts and grants for the purposes of this
- 24 subchapter. The office shall use gifts and grants received for the
- 25 purposes of this subchapter before using any other revenue.
- Sec. 481.607. GRANT PROGRAM RULES. The executive director
- 27 of the office shall adopt rules necessary to administer and

- 1 <u>implement this subchapter.</u>
- 2 SECTION 2. Section 481.078, Government Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Subsection (d-2) to read as follows:
- 4 (d-2) The fund may be used for the community development
- 5 grocery store grant program under Subchapter EE. The governor may
- 6 transfer appropriations from the fund to the office for purposes of
- 7 administering the community development grocery store grant
- 8 program. Subsections (e), (f), (f-1), (f-2), (g), (h), (h-1), (i),
- 9 and (j) and Section 481.080 do not apply to a grant awarded for a
- 10 purpose specified by this subsection.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 481.079(a-1), Government Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a-1) For grants awarded for a purpose specified by Section
- 14 481.078(d-2) [481.078(d-1)], the report must include only the
- 15 amount and recipient [purpose] of each grant.
- SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 17 of this Act, the executive director of the Texas Economic
- 18 Development and Tourism Office shall adopt rules for the
- 19 establishment of the community development grocery store grant
- 20 program under Subchapter EE, Chapter 481, Government Code, as added
- 21 by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
